Hebrews Chapter 1

Prologue – 1:1-4

Many portions – Different disclosures over time, but never the complete revelation.

Many ways – Visions, dreams, angels, events, face to face, in whispers...

These last days – The last days began with the coming of Christ.

God has spoken to us in His Son – The final masterpiece, not in portions but complete!

Heir of all things – Jesus will rule over all things!

Through Whom also He made the world – The word "world" is the Greek word aion which means "ages." The emphasis is that the Son made and directs creation to bring about His Kingdom.

He is the radiance of His glory – Not reflection, but out-shining. The exact representation of His nature – Jesus perfectly revealed what God is like.

He upholds all things by the word of His power – Jesus holds the universe together as He directs it toward His kingdom.

Purification for sins – The first mention of Jesus as God's priest. The implication is that it is complete!

He sat down... - Indicating the Priest-King had finished His work. Note Hebrews 10:12, 12:2, and Revelation 2:21.

Better than the angels – This sets the stage for the rest of the chapter where Christ is shown to be superior to the angels.

He has inherited a more excellent name than they – One's name in the ancient world often described his or her character. No angel ever received the name "the Son of God."

God's King-Son – 1:5-14

Thou art My Son – A quotation from 2 Samuel 7:14. Jesus is the eternal Son of God but also became a son of the Davidic line when He became a man.

When He again brings the first-born into the world – A reference to the second coming of the King.

Let the angels of God worship Him – A quote from Psalm 97:7.

God, Thy God, hath anointed Thee with the oil of gladness above Thy companions – The Greek word for companion is metochoi which translates companion, partner, or partaker. It describes those who participate in the same event or experience.

metochoi is used six times in the New Testament.

Luke 5:7 – Describing Simon, James and John as business partners.

Hebrews 1:9 – *companions* with Christ...

Hebrews 3:1 – *partakers* of the Heavenly calling...

Hebrews 3:14 – *partakers* of Christ...

Hebrews 6:4 – *partakers* of the Holy Spirit...

Hebrews 12:8 – *partakers* of discipline...

The Son is the Immutable Creator (10-12) – The unchanging, eternal Creator-King will remake this universe and rule the new one forever!

The Son is the Waiting Victor (13-14) – Angels are ministering spirits but the Son sits at the right hand of God waiting to return and begin His rule.

Ministering spirits – The role of angels is to minister for our sake in the spiritual realm. They are God's servants who assist us to faithfully persevere.

Those who will inherit salvation – This salvation is not eternal salvation (justification) but future inheritance in the millennial kingdom of the Son.

There is a difference between being in the kingdom and being great in the kingdom (Revelation 2:26-27, Revelation 3:21, 2 Timothy 2:12).
