Introduction

Historical Background

-In 356 B.C. Philip II, King of Macedonia renamed the city of "Krinides" after himself and called it Philippi.

-In 42 and 31 B.C. strategic military battles were fought in Philippi and the city eventually became the leading Roman city in the district of Macedonia.



Biblical Background

Philippi is mentioned four times in the New Testament.

Acts 16:12

Acts 20:6

Philippians 1:1

1 Thessalonians 2:2

Acts 16 is the story of the founding of the church in Philippi. Paul first visits Philippi on his second missionary journey.

Paul's 2nd missionary journey - Acts 15:36 through Acts18:22. Philippi first visited in Acts 16:12

Paul's 3nd missionary journey - Acts 18:23 through Acts 19:26. He goes to Philippi in Acts 20:1-2 and returns through Philippi in Acts 20:6



Acts 16 - Paul establishes the church at Philippi

Verse 13

Outside the gate – Probably because there was no Jewish synagogue in Philippi

Verses 14-15 - Lydia (verse 40) - A worshiper of God.

Verses 16-24 - Persecution for their faith.

Verse 25 – Response in the midst of persecution.

Verses 26-29 - God's deliverance

Verses 30-34 – Salvation of the Philippian jailer.

Verses 35-40 – Paul's response to the authorities and departure from Philippi.

Paul pens the letter of Philippians during his Roman imprisonment (A.D. 60-62).
