Romans 5:1-5

Righteousness Revealed in Justification - 3:21-5:21

Chapters 5 through 8 show how the gospel furnishes power to the justified to live a radical new life! Chapter 5 is a transition to chapters 6 through 8.

Life is mentioned only 3 times in chapters 1 - 4. Life is mentioned 25 times in chapters 5 - 8!

Verse 1

Therefore – Points back to the truth of justification by faith alone and signals that what follows rests on this truth.

Paul gives 7 benefits of justification by faith. The first is the certainty of our justification.

Benefit 1:

Having been justified – This is an aorist participle which looks back at a finished act.

Benefit 2:

We have peace with God – A present possession stemming from our past justification.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ – Not only is our past justification secure through Jesus Christ because of His death for our sins, our present relationship is available because of His life.

Verse 2 Benefit 3:

We have access – This word is only used three times in the New Testament, all by Paul, and in each context it is a reference to the believer's privilege of approaching the Father's throne. Note Ephesians 2:18, 3:12.

By faith – As peace with God comes by faith, so also justifying faith grants us access to God's throne to praise, pray, or petition Him.

Faith – The word is used 40 times in Romans.

Romans 1 - 4 = 25 times

Romans 5 - 8 = 2 times

Romans 9 - 16 = 13 times

Into this grace in which we stand – The same grace that justifies us also enables us to live or experience eternal life. This is a permanent, accomplished position that has ongoing benefits.

We exult in hope of the glory of God -

PAST – We are justified by faith!

PRESENT - We have peace and access to God!

FUTURE – We look forward to our participation in the glory of God!

All phases of God's salvation are reason for us to rejoice!

Verse 3

Benefit 4:

We can rejoice in suffering! WHY? Tribulations or sufferings produce three results or qualities:

- 1 Perseverance
- 2 Proven Character
- 3 Hope

Verse 4

- 1 *Perseverance* The continued capacity to bear-up under difficulties.
- 2 *Proven Character* Character that is validated by the one persevering.
- 3 Hope The expectation of glorifying God and being approved by Him when He appears.

Verse 5

This hope does not disappoint – It will not allow us to be put to shame.

Benefit 5: The indwelling Holy Spirit!

The love of God has been poured out within our hearts – We know or realize God's love through our experience of tribulations.

WHY? The indwelling Holy Spirit!

Through the Holy Spirit who was given to us – The Holy Spirit is given to all believers at the moment of justification for the purpose of aiding us in life and suffering. Note John 14:16-17, 26, 16:7, 13-15.

Seven benefits of justification by faith:

- 1 Our past justification is secure.
- 2 We have peace with God.
- 3 We have access to God.
- 4 We can exult in tribulations.
- 5 We have the indwelling Holy Spirit.
