Prayer as a Muscle: Developing Healthy Prayer Habits

Philippians 4:6 - Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.

Developing a healthy prayer life requires us to:

- 1. Do it regularly
- 2. Do it right

Practical Prayer Tools:

- 1. Posture matters Praying from bended knee
 - a. Daniel 6:10 Now when Daniel knew that the writing was signed, he went into his house and his windows being open in his chamber toward Jerusalem, he kneeled upon his knees three times a day, and prayed, and gave thanks before his God, as he did aforetime.
 - b. 1 Kings 8:54 And so it was, that when Solomon had made an end of praying all this prayer and supplication unto the Lord, he arose from before the altar of the Lord, from kneeling on his knees with his hands spread up to heaven.
 - c. Ephesians 3:14 For this cause **I bow my knees** unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

2. Pray out-loud

- a. Psalm 66:13-14 I will go into thy house with burnt offerings: I will pay my vows, which my lips have uttered, and my mouth hath spoken, when I was in trouble.
- b. Psalm 66:17 I cried unto him with my mouth, and he was extolled with my tongue.
- c. Psalm 66:19 But verily God hath heard me; he hath attended **the voice** of my prayer.
- 3. Prayer should be coupled with Bible study
 - a. Daniel 9:2-3 In the first year of his reign I Daniel understood by books the number of years, whereof the word of the Lord came to Jeremiah the prophet, that he would accomplish seventy years in the desolation of Jerusalem. And I set my face unto the Lord God, to seek by prayer and supplications, with fasting, and sackcloth, and ashes:
- 4. The Lord will ignore prayer where there is sin
 - a. Isaiah 59:2 But your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid his face from you, that **he will not hear**.
 - b. Micah 3:4 Then shall they cry unto the Lord, but **he will not hear** them: he will even hide his face from them at that time, as they have behaved themselves ill in their doings.
 - c. Psalm 66:18 If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me:
 - d. Proverbs 28:9 He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be an abomination.

5. Begin prayers with praise and thanks

- a. Isaiah 25:1 Oh Lord, thou art my God; I will exalt thee, I will praise thy name; for though hast done wonderful things; thy counsels of old are faithfulness and truth.
- b. Psalm 145: 1-2 I will extol thee, my God, O king; and I will bless thy name forever and ever. Every day will I bless thee; and I will praise thy name for ever and ever.
- c. Philippians 4:6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.
- d. Psalm 18:49 Therefore will I **give thanks** unto thee, O Lord, among the heathen, and sing praises unto thy name.

6. Be specific and deliberate in your prayers

- a. Matthew 6:7-8 But when ye pray, **use not vain repetitions**, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking. Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask of him.
- b. Matthew 7:7-12 Ask, and it shall be given to you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you: For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened. Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone? Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent? If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?
- c. 1 John 5:14 And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, **if we ask any thing** according to his will, **he heareth us**.
- d. John 16:23b-24 Verily, verily, I say unto you, whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it you. Hitherto have ye asked nothing in my name: **ask, and ye shall receive** that your joy may be full.

7. Trust the Lord to Answer

- a. James 1:5-6 If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him **ask in faith**, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed.
- b. Matthew 21:22 In all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive.
