

Bible Study Summary: Philippians 3:17–21

Overview

This Bible study focused on Philippians 3:17–21, exploring Paul's exhortation to follow his example, the dangers of legalism and hedonism, and the hope of our heavenly citizenship and resurrection. The discussion also included related passages in John 1, Ephesians, 1 Corinthians 5 & 15, and Hebrews 12, with practical applications for living out the gospel in a culture prone to both self-righteousness and self-indulgence.

Core Scripture: > Philippians 3:17–21 (NKJV) > > "Brethren, join in following my example, and note those who so walk, as you have us for a pattern. For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, that they are the enemies of the cross of Christ: whose end is destruction, whose god is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame—who set their mind on earthly things. For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body that it
