1. Tell The _____ People You Meet *Along The Way*...

...They've Stopped Short Of The _____.

Acts 24:1-3 (NIV2011) "Five days later <u>the high priest Ananias went down</u> to Caesarea with some of the elders and a lawyer named Tertullus, and <u>they</u> brought their charges against Paul before the governor.² When Paul was called in, <u>Tertullus presented his case before Felix</u>: 'We have enjoyed a long period of peace under you, and your foresight has brought about reforms in this nation.³ Everywhere and in every way, <u>most excellent Felix</u>, we acknowledge this with profound gratitude."

Acts 24:4-9 (NIV2011) "[Tertullus continued]... 'In order not to weary you further, I would request that you be kind enough to hear us briefly. ⁵ <u>We have</u> found this man to be a troublemaker, stirring up riots among the Jews all over the world. <u>He is a ringleader</u> of the Nazarene sect ⁶ and even tried to desecrate the Temple; so we seized him. ⁷ But the commander, Lysias, came and with the use of much force snatched him from our hands. ⁸ By examining him yourself you will be able to learn the truth about all these charges we are bringing against him.' ⁹ The other Jews joined in the accusation, asserting that these things were true."

Acts 24:10 (NIV2011) "When the governor motioned for him to speak, Paul replied: '<u>I know that for a number of years you have been a judge over this nation</u>; so I gladly make my defense."

Acts 24:11-13 (NIV2011) "[Paul continued]... 'You can easily verify that no more than twelve days ago I went up to Jerusalem to worship. ¹² <u>My accusers</u> did not find me arguing with anyone at the <u>Temple</u>, or stirring up a crowd in the synagogues or anywhere else in the city. ¹³ And they cannot prove to you the charges they are now making against me.""

Acts 24:14-15 (NIV2011) "[Paul continued further]... 'I admit that <u>I worship</u> the God of our ancestors as a follower of the Way, which they call a sect. <u>I believe everything</u> that is in accordance with the Law and that is written in the Prophets, ¹⁵ and I have the same hope in God as these men themselves have, that there will be a resurrection of both the righteous and the wicked." Acts 24:16-18 (NIV2011) "[Paul spoke]... 'I strive always to keep my conscience clear before God and man. ¹⁷After an absence of several years, <u>I came to Jerusalem to bring my people gifts for the poor and to present offerings</u>. ¹⁸<u>I was ceremonially clean when they found me in the Temple courts</u> doing this. There was no crowd with me, nor was I involved in any disturbance."

Acts 24:19-20 (NIV2011) "[Paul spoke further]... 'There are <u>some Jews</u> from the province of Asia, who ought to be here before you and <u>bring charges</u> if they have anything against me.²⁰ Or these who are here should state what crime they found in me when I stood before the Sanhedrin...'"

Acts 24:20-21 (NIV2011) "[Paul concluded]... 'These who are here should <u>state</u> <u>what crime they found in me</u> when I stood before the Sanhedrin—²¹<u>unless it</u> <u>was this one thing</u> I shouted as I stood in their presence: "<u>It is concerning</u> <u>the RESURRECTION of the dead that I am on trial before you today</u>."""

Acts 24:22-23 (NIV2011) "Then <u>Felix</u>, <u>who was well acquainted with the Way</u>, adjourned the proceedings. <u>'When Lysias the commander comes</u>,' he said, <u>'I will decide your case</u>.' ²³ He ordered the centurion to keep Paul under guard but to give him some freedom and permit his friends to take care of his needs."

Acts 24:24-25 (NIV2011) "Several days later Felix came with his wife Drusilla, who was Jewish. He sent for Paul and listened to him as he spoke about faith in Christ Jesus. ²⁵ <u>As Paul talked</u> about <u>righteousness</u>, <u>self-control and the judgment</u> to come, <u>Felix was afraid</u> and said, <u>'That's enough for now</u>! <u>You may leave</u>. When I find it convenient, <u>I will send for you</u>.'"

Acts 24:26 (NIV2011) "At the same time [Felix] was hoping that Paul would offer him a bribe, so he sent for him frequently and talked with him."

Acts 24:27 (NIV2011) "<u>When two years had passed</u>, <u>Felix was succeeded by</u> <u>Porcius Festus</u>, but <u>because Felix wanted to grant a favor to the Jews</u>, <u>he left</u> <u>Paul in prison</u>."
