5. Being a good teammate often means valuing others above yourself to help everyone win. What is the biggest obstacle that keeps you from leveraging your God-given talents, wiring, skills, and experience to help others win?
6. If you're currently sitting “on the bench,” what would it look like for you to “get in the game” at Woodstock City Church? If you're already an active teammate, how could you help someone else get in the game?
