- 4. What are your thoughts on the pastor's interpretation of "phobotron" as potentially referring to monsters or otherworldly beings? How does this align with or challenge your understanding of end-times prophecy?
- 5. Pastor Mark presented two possible interpretations for the "restrainer" the Holy Spirit or the Church. Which interpretation resonates more with you, and why?



6. How does the promise of Christ's return and the rapture of believers affect your daily life and decisions?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Strengthen your discernment: Commit to regular Bible study and prayer to help you distinguish truth from deception in today's world.
- 2. Be a "restrainer": Identify one way you can be "salt and light" in your community this week, helping to preserve goodness and shine truth.
- 3. Serve faithfully: Choose a specific area in your church or community where you can increase your service to others, remembering that we are "saved to do good works."
- 4. Share the Gospel: Make a plan to share your faith with at least one person who doesn't know Jesus, recognizing the urgency emphasized in the sermon.
- 5. Stand firm: Identify any areas in your life where you may be wavering in your faith or compromising biblical values. Commit to standing firm in those areas.
