Psalm 107:1–3 (NASB95)

1 Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, For His lovingkindness is everlasting.

2 Let the redeemed of the LORD **say so**, Whom He has redeemed from the hand of the adversary

3 And gathered from the lands, From the east and from the west, From the north and from the south.

When was this written?

Who was to “say so”?

redeem | rə'dēm | verb [*with object*]

1 compensate for the faults or bad aspects of (something).

- (**redeem oneself**) do something that compensates for poor past performance or behavior.
- (of a person) atone or make amends for (error or evil).
- save (someone) from sin, error, or evil.

2 gain or regain possession of (something) in exchange for payment: *his best suit had been redeemed from the pawnbrokers.*

Psalm 107:1 (NASB95)

1 Oh **give thanks** to the LORD, for He is good, For His lovingkindness is everlasting.

Psalm 107:8 (NASB95)

8 Let them **give thanks** to the LORD for His lovingkindness, And for His wonders to the sons of men!

Psalm 107:15 (NASB95)

15 Let them **give thanks** to the LORD for His lovingkindness, And for His wonders to the sons of men!

Psalm 107:21 (NASB95)

21 Let them **give thanks** to the LORD for His lovingkindness, And for His wonders to the sons of men!

Psalm 107:31 (NASB95)

31 Let them **give thanks** to the LORD for His lovingkindness, And for His wonders to the sons of men!

When were they to say it?

Psalm 107:6 (NASB95)

6 Then they cried out to the LORD **in their trouble**; He delivered them **out of their distresses**.

Psalm 107:13 (NASB95)

13 Then they cried out to the LORD **in their trouble**; He saved them **out of their distresses**.

Psalm 107:19 (NASB95)

19 Then they cried out to the LORD **in their trouble**; He saved them **out of their distresses**.

Psalm 107:28 (NASB95)

28 Then they cried to the LORD **in their trouble**, And He brought them **out of their distresses**.

What was the testimony?

Psalm 107:28–31 (NASB95)

28 Then they **cried to the LORD** in their trouble, and **He brought them out** of their distresses.

29 He caused the storm to be still, so that the waves of the sea were hushed.

30 Then they were glad because they were quiet, so **He guided them** to their desired haven.

31 Let them **give thanks to the LORD** for His lovingkindness, and for His wonders to the sons of men!

What is God's warning?

Psalm 107:42–43 (NASB95)

42 The **upright** see it and are glad; But all **unrighteousness** shuts its mouth.

43 Who is wise? Let him **give heed** to these things, and **consider the lovingkindnesses of the LORD**.

Luke 19:37–40 (NASB95)

37 As soon as He was approaching, near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of the disciples began to praise God joyfully **with a loud voice** for all the miracles which they had seen,

38 shouting: "BLESSED IS THE KING WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD; Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

39 Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples."

40 But Jesus answered, "**I tell you, if these become silent, the stones will cry out!**"
