Discussion Questions:

3. The sermon emphasized the importance of prayer. How can we cultivate a stronger prayer life individually and as a church community?
4. The pastor shared a personal story about backsliding. Have you ever experienced a similar situation? How did you overcome it?
5. Discuss the statement: "We are prophetic and not pathetic." What does this mean to you in practical terms?

6. How can we ensure that our lives are truly reflecting Christ to the world around us?
7. The sermon mentioned the importance of the Word of God as our "plumb line." How can we make Bible study a more integral part of our daily lives?

Practical Applications:

1. Set aside 15 minutes each day this week for focused prayer and Bible reading.
2. Identify one area in your life where you need to let God "rebuild" you. Share with a partner and pray for each other.
3. Practice "letting your light shine" this week by intentionally performing acts of kindness or sharing your faith with someone.
4. Evaluate your current involvement in the church. Is there an area where you could serve more or use your gifts to build up the body of Christ?
5. Write down three ways you can improve your integrity this week, whether at work, home, or in your personal life.

Encourage group members to share prayer requests and pray for one another, focusing on areas where they need God's help to be better representatives of His church.
