Opening Prayer

Icebreaker

Icebreaker Question: What's one area of your life where you feel God has given you "title and deed" but you haven't yet "taken possession"?

Key Sermon Themes

Understanding the Names

- · Joshua (Yahshua) = "The Lord is Salvation"
- Jesus (Yeshua) = "I Am Salvation"
- Emmanuel = "God With Us"

Key Insight: Joshua still needed a Savior (Yahweh), but Jesus said "I AM salvation."

Discussion Questions:

Part 1: The Lord's Preparation (15 minutes)

Read Joshua 1:1-9

 God told Israel He had given them the land, but they still had to "take possession" of it. What does this teach us about God's promises and our responsibility?



- 2. The people of Jericho were terrified for 40 years while Israel wandered in the wilderness. What opportunities might we be missing because of fear or disobedience?
- 3. God repeated "Be strong and courageous" three times. Why do you think Christians struggle so much with fear today? What specific fears are holding you back?

Reflection: Where has God already prepared a path for your life that you haven't stepped into yet?

Part 2: The Lord's Positioning (15 minutes)

Read Joshua 3:14-17 & Colossians 2:11-12

- 4. The Israelites had to step into the flooded Jordan River before God rolled it back. What does this teach us about faith and obedience working together?
- 5. Why did God require circumcision right before battle? What does "removal of the flesh" look like in our daily Christian walk?
- 6. How does water baptism serve as the New Testament picture of what happened at the Jordan crossing?

Personal Application: Have you been baptized? If not, what's holding you back from this act of obedience?

Part 3: The Lord's Plan (15 minutes)

Read Joshua 5:13-15 & Joshua 6:1-5

- 7. Joshua met the "Captain of the Lord's host" (Jesus) before the battle. Why is it significant that Jesus appeared with a sword (representing God's Word)?
- 8. God's plan to defeat Jericho (marching and shouting) didn't make logical sense. When has God asked you to do something that didn't make sense, but you obeyed anyway?
- 9. Pastor Mark emphasized meditating on God's Word "day and night" (Joshua 1:8). How much time are you currently spending in God's Word? What changes need to be made?

Challenge: "You show me how much time you're spending in God's word, and I'll show you how much you're actually claiming."Practical Applications



Part 4: Joshua's Announcement (10 minutes)

Read Joshua 24:14-15

- 10. Joshua declared, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." What does it practically look like to make this declaration over your home and family today?
- 11. Pastor Mark asked: "Are there areas of your life where you're still living in the wilderness?" What would it look like to cross over into the "promised land" in those areas?

Key Takeaways

- God has already given us the title and deed to spiritual blessings, but we must step out in faith to take possession of them.
- Be strong and courageous God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, love, and a sound mind.
- Meditate on God's Word day and night Pastor's message on Sunday isn't enough to sustain us all week.
- God's plan is always better than ours Even when it doesn't make logical sense.
- Choose today whom you will serve Make the announcement over your life, home, and family.

Practical Applications

This Week's Action Steps:

- 1. Daily Word Commitment
- Commit to reading God's Word for at least 15 minutes each day this week
- Choose a specific time and place
- Share your commitment with the group for accountability



2. Identify Your "Jordan River"

- Write down one area where God is calling you to step out in faith
- What's the first step of obedience you need to take?
- Pray specifically about this each day

3. Remove the Flesh

- Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal areas of "flesh" that need to be removed
- If you haven't been baptized, consider signing up for the December 14th baptism
- Identify one habit or attitude that needs to die so Christ can live more fully in you

4. Make Your Announcement

- Write out your own version of "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord"
- Share it with your family or post it somewhere visible in your home
- Declare God's Word over your home, marriage, children, and circumstances

Prayer Focus (10 minutes)

Pray together for:

- Courage to step into what God has already given us
- Removal of fear and embrace of boldness
- Commitment to God's Word daily
- Specific "Jordan Rivers" group members are facing
- Families and homes to fully serve the Lord

Closing Declaration:

Have each person declare: "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord!"



Before Next Week

- Read Joshua chapters 1-6 in preparation for continued discussion
- Journal about areas where you're "taking new ground" in faith
- Encourage one another through text or calls about daily Word reading.

Leader Notes

- Be sensitive to those who may not have been baptized make it invitational, not condemning
- Allow space for people to share fears they're struggling with
- Celebrate testimonies of where people have stepped out in faith
- Consider having someone share about their baptism experience if applicable
