



Where is Jesus? PT.1|Genesis|Mark Allen|10.12.25

Opening Prayer:

Begin the session with a prayer, asking God to guide your discussion and help the group apply the sermon's teachings to their lives.

Key Takeaways:

- 1. Genesis reveals mankind's inadequacies when apart from God.
- 2. The book can be divided into three sections: natural relationships (science), human relationships, and spiritual relationships.
- 3. Five key men in Genesis (Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph) illustrate different aspects of salvation and our relationship with God.
- 4. Mankind has always desired righteousness, peace, and joy, which can only truly be found in God.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Pastor Mark mentioned that science without God is inadequate. How do you reconcile faith and science in your own life?
- 2. How does the story of Noah demonstrate God's grace? Can you think of a time in your life when you experienced undeserved favor?
- 3. Abraham was justified by his faith. What does it mean to you to live by faith in your daily life?
- 4. Isaac represents sonship in God's family. How does knowing you are a child of God impact your identity and actions?



- 5. Jacob's story illustrates the process of sanctification. What areas of your life are you currently wrestling with God about?
- 6. Joseph's life journey culminated in glorification. How does the promise of future glory with Christ affect your perspective on current struggles?
- 7. The sermon emphasized that we can't find true righteousness, peace, and joy without God. How have you experienced this truth in your own life?

Practical Applications:

- 1. This week, try to identify one area where you've been trying to live independently from God. Make a conscious effort to invite God into that aspect of your life.
- 2. Practice looking for Jesus in unexpected places, especially when reading the Old Testament. Share any insights with the group next time.
- 3. Reflect on your own spiritual journey. Which stage (regeneration, justification, sonship, sanctification, or glorification) do you feel you're currently experiencing most strongly?
- 4. If you haven't already, consider sharing your testimony of salvation with someone this week, inspired by the many who responded to the altar call.
- 5. Spend time in prayer, thanking God for His work in your life from salvation to glorification.

Closing Prayer:

Close the session by thanking God for His word, asking for His help in applying these truths, and praying for any specific needs shared by group members.
