

Say What?

Part 2

Psalm 107:1–3 (NASB95)

1 Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, For His lovingkindness is everlasting.

2 Let the redeemed of the LORD **say so**, Whom He has redeemed from the hand of the adversary.

1. The Messiah will feel forsaken by God at His crucifixion.

Psalm 22:1 (NASB95)

1 **My God, my God, why have You forsaken me?** Far from my deliverance are the words of my groaning.

Mark 15:34 (NASB95)

34 At the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, “**ELOI, ELOI, LAMA SABACHTHANI?**” which is translated, “**MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAVE YOU FORSAKEN ME?**”

2. The Messiah will pray before His death.

Psalm 22:2 (NASB95)

2 **O my God**, I cry by day, but You do not answer; And by night, but I have no rest.

Matthew 26:38–39 (NASB95)

38 Then He said to them, “**My soul is deeply grieved, to the point of death; remain here and keep watch with Me.**”

39 And He went a little beyond them, and fell on His face **and prayed**, saying, “**My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; yet not as I will, but as You will.**”

3. The Messiah will be despised and rejected by His own.

Psalm 22:6 (NASB95)

6 But I am a worm and not a man, A reproach of men and **despised** by the people.

Luke 23:21–23 (NASB95)

21 but they kept on calling out, saying, “Crucify, crucify Him!”

22 And he said to them the third time, “Why, what evil has this man done? I have found in Him no guilt demanding death; therefore I will punish Him and release Him.”

23 But they were insistent, with loud voices asking that He be crucified. And their voices began to prevail.

4. The Messiah will be mocked.

Psalm 22:7 (NASB95)

7 All who see me **sneer at me**; They separate with the lip, they **wag the head**, saying,

Matthew 27:39 (NASB95)

39 And those passing by were hurling abuse at Him, wagging their heads

5. **Unbelievers will say to the Messiah, "He trusted in God, let Him now deliver Him".**

Psalm 22:8 (NASB95)

8 "Commit yourself to the LORD; **let Him deliver him**; Let Him rescue him, because He delights in him."

Matthew 27:41–43 (NASB95)

41 In the same way the chief priests also, along with the scribes and elders, were mocking Him and saying,

42 "He saved others; He cannot save Himself. He is the King of Israel; let Him now come down from the cross, and we will believe in Him.

43 "HE TRUSTS IN GOD; **LET GOD RESCUE Him** NOW, IF HE DELIGHTS IN HIM; for He said, 'I am the Son of God.' "

6. **The Messiah will be abandoned by His disciples.**

Psalm 22:11 (NASB95)

11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near; For there is none to help.

Mark 14:50 (NASB95)

50 And they all left Him and fled.

7. **From the Messiah's body will flow blood and water.**

Psalm 22:14 (NASB95)

14 I am **poured out like water**, and all my bones are out of joint; My heart is like wax; It is melted within me.

John 19:34 (NASB95)

34 But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately **blood and water** came out.

8. **The Messiah will thirst while dying.**

Psalm 22:15 (NASB95)

15 My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and **my tongue cleaves to my jaws**; And You lay me in the dust of death.

John 19:28 (NASB95)

28 After this, Jesus, knowing that all things had already been accomplished, to fulfill the Scripture, said, **"I am thirsty."**

9. The Messiah will be observed by Gentiles and Jews at His crucifixion.

Psalms 22:16a (NASB95)

16 For dogs have surrounded me; A band of evildoers has encompassed me;

Luke 23:36 (NASB95)

36 The **soldiers** also mocked Him, coming up to Him, offering Him sour wine,

Matthew 27:41–43 (NASB95)

41 In the same way the **chief priests** also, along with the scribes and elders, were mocking Him and saying,

10. The Messiah's hands and feet will be pierced.

Psalms 22:16b–17 (NASB95)

16 ...; **They pierced my hands and my feet.**

17 I can count all my bones. They look, they stare at me;

Matthew 27:38 (NASB95)

38 At that time two robbers were **crucified** with Him, one on the right and one on the left.

11. The Messiah's garments will be divided among the soldiers through the casting of lots.

Psalms 22:18 (NASB95)

18 They divide my **garments** among them, and for my clothing they **cast lots**.

John 19:23–24 (NASB95)

23 Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, **took His outer garments** and made four parts, a part to every soldier and also the tunic; now the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece.

24 So they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but **cast lots** for it, to decide whose it shall be"; this was to fulfill the Scripture: "THEY DIVIDED MY OUTER GARMENTS AMONG THEM, AND FOR MY CLOTHING THEY **CAST LOTS**."

12. Resurrection Predicted

Psalm 22:31 (NASB95)

31 They will come and will declare His righteousness to a people **who will be born**, that He has performed it.

1 Corinthians 15:3–6 (NASB95)

3 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures,

4 and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures,

5 and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve.

6 After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep;
