Discussion Questions:

- The questions we started the message with:
 - On a scale from 1-10, how much do you know about the Bible?
 - On a scale from 1-10, how much do you know about the Old Testament?
 - On a scale from 1-10, how much do you know about the Minor Prophets?
 - On a scale from 1-10, how much do you know about Habakkuk?
 - How much did this message affect your answer?

- What was the last situation in your life or world event that caused you to ask, “why do bad things keep happening to good people?”

- Which is harder for you to make sense of – bad things happening to good people or good things happening to bad people?

- Do you agree with the definition we used for faith – living as though what God says is true is true.”? Why or why not?
 - What are some potential problems in our daily lives if we lived by that definition?
 - What are some potential benefits in our daily lives if we lived by that definition?

- If you could have a conversation with God like Habakkuk did, what would you want to discuss with Him and get His answers/explanations about?

- We said that when reading and interpreting the Minor Prophets, we seek to understand the original context and audience, we look for principles (about the character of God, the human condition, and the intersection of those two), and we apply as appropriate.
 - What, if anything, does Habakkuk teach us about the character of God?
 - What, if anything, does Habakkuk teach us about the human condition?
 - What, if anything, does Habakkuk teach us about the intersection of those two?
 - What, if anything, from the book of Habakkuk should you apply to your life?
