


Genesis 6:9-8:20

Noah and the Flood

⁹These are the generations of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation.

Noah walked with God. ¹⁰ And Noah had three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

- Generations – 10x in Genesis (Structure)



- Righteous, blameless, generation –
 - Blameless
 - Same words said of Job – Job 1:8; 2:3
 - **Abram's** belief was “counted as righteousness” – Genesis 15:5-6
 - Also, Noah, Daniel, and Job – Ezekiel 14:14, 20
 - They still needed Jesus for salvation
 - They walked with God, and in comparison to their generation, they stood out.

¹¹ Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight, and the earth was filled with violence. ¹² And

God saw the earth, and behold, it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth.

- Corrupt – ruined, spilled, spoiled, wasted, wrecked
- filled with violence. – Today, violence is the standard.
 - I like a good action movie, but, since people have become numb to the standard shoot-em-up, media companies are pushing farther into stimulus.
 - Violence is rampant in our world, and it was in Noah's.

¹³ And God said to Noah, “I have determined to make an end of all flesh, for the earth is filled with violence through them. Behold, I will destroy them with the earth. ¹⁴ Make yourself an ark of gopher wood. Make rooms in the ark, and cover it inside and out with pitch.

- I have determined...end of all flesh – This must have been frightening to Noah.

- **Cover** – כָּפַר – Kâphar –kaw-far' – Kah-Far, to cover over, **make atonement**, atone for sin, make atonement for
 - **Pitch** – Very close – כָּפַר – kôpher
 - If there were a billion people on earth at that time, the judgment would eclipse every other catastrophe in history.
 - **Catastrophe**
 - WWII – 60 million and 75 million dead
 - WWI – 15 to 22 million
 - US Civil War – 620,000 to 750,000 (Deadliest conflict in US history)
 - Chairman Mao – 45 million to 70 million people due to his policies, particularly during the Great Leap Forward and the Cultural Revolution.
 - Stalin – 20 million, but some estimates go as high as 60 million
 - Black plague – Overall, the total death toll across Eurasia and North Africa may have reached as high as 200 million
 - Not just to destroy sinful man¹
 - All land animals and birds, and destroy the surface of the Earth
 - This was the greatest catastrophe the Earth has ever experienced

¹⁵This is how you are to make it: the length of the ark **300 cubits**, its breadth **50 cubits**, and its height **30 cubits**. ¹⁶Make a roof for the ark, and finish it to a cubit above, and set the door of the ark in its side. Make it with lower, second, and third decks.

- According to Genesis 6, the dimensions of Noah's Ark are **approximately 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet high**. These measurements are based on the biblical cubit, which is estimated to be about **18 inches**.

¹⁷For behold, I will bring a flood of waters upon the earth to destroy all flesh in which is the breath of life under heaven. Everything that is on the earth shall die. ¹⁸But I will establish **my**

¹ 30:50

covenant with you, and you shall come into the ark, you, your sons, your wife, and your sons' wives with you.

- **my covenant** – 1ST Mention of Covenant

¹⁹ And of every living thing of all flesh, you shall bring two of every sort into the ark to keep them alive with you. They shall be male and female. ²⁰ Of the birds according to their kinds, and of the animals according to their kinds, of every creeping thing of the ground, according to its kind, two of every sort shall come in to you to keep them alive. ²¹ Also take with you every sort of food that is eaten, and store it up. It shall serve as food for you and for them.” ²² Noah did this; he did all that God commanded him.

Chapter 7 –¹ Then the Lord said to Noah, “Go into the ark, you and all your household, for I have seen that you are righteous before me in this generation.

- “**Come**” KJV – And the Lord said unto Noah, **Come** thou and all thy house into the ark; for thee have I seen righteous before me in this generation.
 - **Matthew 11:28-30** –²⁸ **Come** to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.”
 - **John 7:37-39** –³⁷ On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, “If anyone thirsts, let him **come** to me and drink. ³⁸ Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, ‘Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.’” ³⁹ Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him

were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

- [Revelation 22:17](#) – ¹⁷ The **Spirit** and the **Bride** say, “**Come.**” And let the one who hears say, “**Come.**” And let the one who is thirsty **come**; let the one who desires take the water of life without price.

² Take with you seven pairs of all clean animals, the male and his mate, and a pair of the animals that are not clean, the male and his mate, ³ and seven pairs of the birds of the heavens also, male and female, to keep their offspring alive on the face of all the earth. ⁴ For in seven days I will send rain on the earth forty days and forty nights, and every living thing that I have made I will blot out from the face of the ground.” ⁵ And Noah did all that the Lord had commanded him.

⁶ Noah was six hundred years old when the flood of waters came upon the earth. ⁷ And Noah and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives with him went into the ark to escape the waters of the flood. ⁸ Of clean animals, and of animals that are not clean, and of birds, and of everything that creeps on the ground, ⁹ two and two, male and female, went into the ark with Noah, as God had commanded Noah.

- Clean? – Ceremonial clean
 - Apparently, God let them know what was acceptable. Adam?

¹⁰ And after seven days the waters of the flood came upon the earth.

- after seven days – Did the people mock Noah during this time?
- We are in Christ; He called us in, and the world mocks. Judgment is coming, just like in the days of Noah.

¹¹ In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, on the seventeenth day of the month, on that day all the fountains of the great deep burst forth, and the windows of the heavens were opened. ¹² And rain fell upon the earth forty days and forty nights. ¹³ On the very same day Noah and his sons, Shem and Ham and Japheth, and Noah's wife and the three wives of his sons

with them entered the ark, ¹⁴ they and every beast, according to its kind, and all the livestock according to their kinds, and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth, according to its kind, and every bird, according to its kind, every winged creature. ¹⁵ They went into the ark with Noah, two and two of all flesh in which there was the breath of life. ¹⁶ And those that entered, male and female of all flesh, went in as God had commanded him. And the Lord shut him in.

- And the Lord shut him in – **one way**

¹⁷ The flood continued forty days on the earth. The waters increased and bore up the ark, and it rose high above the earth. ¹⁸ The waters prevailed and increased greatly on the earth, and the ark floated on the face of the waters. ¹⁹ And the waters prevailed so mightily on the earth that all the high mountains under the whole heaven were covered. ²⁰ The waters prevailed above the mountains, covering them fifteen cubits deep. ²¹ And all flesh died that moved on the earth, birds, livestock, beasts, all swarming creatures that swarm on the earth, and all mankind. ²² Everything on the dry land in whose nostrils was the breath of life died. ²³ He blotted out every living thing that was on the face of the ground, man and animals and creeping things and birds of the heavens. They were blotted out from the earth. Only Noah was left, and those who were with him in the ark. ²⁴ And the waters prevailed on the earth 150 days.

Chapter 8 – ¹But God remembered Noah and all the beasts and all the livestock that were

with him in the ark. And God made **a wind** blow over the earth, and the waters subsided.

- God remembered
- **a wind**

² The fountains of the deep and the windows of the heavens were closed, the rain from the heavens was restrained, ³ and the waters receded from the earth continually. At the end of 150

days the waters had abated, ⁴ and in the **seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month**, the ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat.

- [Exodus 12:2](#) – ²“This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you.
 - The calendar is changed 7th month becomes 1st
 - Passover on 14th day of 1st month
 - Christ is Passover
 - 17th is **three days** after 14th
- **Dr. John Anton** – “In my humble opinion, my analysis of the map Cornuke used from the guy who purportedly saw it in the 1940s does not match up well with the site that was explored there in the early 2000s. All my work points to Armenia.”

⁵ And the waters continued to abate until the tenth month; in the tenth month, on the first day of the month, the tops of the mountains were seen.

⁶ At the end of forty days Noah opened the window of the ark that he had made ⁷ and sent forth a raven. It went to and fro until the waters were dried up from the earth. ⁸ Then he sent forth a dove from him, to see if the waters had subsided from the face of the ground. ⁹ But the dove found no place to set her foot, and she returned to him to the ark, for the waters were still on the face of the whole earth. So he put out his hand and took her and brought her into the ark with him. ¹⁰ He waited another seven days, and again he sent forth the dove out of the ark. ¹¹ And the dove came back to him in the evening, and behold, in her mouth was a freshly **plucked olive leaf**. So Noah knew that the waters had subsided from the earth. ¹² Then he waited another seven days and sent forth the dove, and she did not return to him anymore.

¹³ In the **six hundred and first year**, in the first month, the first day of the month, the waters were dried from off the earth. And Noah removed the covering of the ark and looked, and behold, the face of the ground was dry. ¹⁴ In the **second month**, on the twenty-seventh day of the month, the

earth had dried out. ¹⁵ Then God said to Noah, ¹⁶ “**Go out** from the ark, you and your wife, and your sons and your sons' wives with you. ¹⁷ Bring out with you every living thing that is with you of all flesh—birds and animals and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth—that they may swarm on the earth, and be fruitful and multiply on the earth.”

- God 1st spoke “Come” and then we have nothing recorded till “Go”
 - Did Noah get discouraged?
 - Are you discouraged? In the Ark, yes, but need to hear from Him?
 - Know He remembers you!

¹⁸ So Noah went out, and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives with him. ¹⁹ Every beast, every creeping thing, and every bird, everything that moves on the earth, went out by families from the ark.

Neither will I ever again strike down every living creature as I have done. ²² While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease.”
