**“Man’s chief end is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever. “
-The Westminster Catechism**

Then Moses said, “Now show me your glory.” And the Lord said, “I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the Lord, in your presence.” (Exodus 33:18-19a, NIV)

God’s glory is the full manifestation of His very essence.

“Then the Lord came down in a cloud and stood there with him; and he called out his own name, Yāhweh. The Lord passed in front of Moses, calling out, ‘Yāhweh! The Lord!...’” (Exodus 34:5-6a, NLT)

“I saw the Lord, high and lifted up, seated on the throne, and the train of his robe filled the temple.” (Isaiah 6:1, NLT)

In Jesus we see the glory of God in concentrated form.

“The Son is the radiance of God’s glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word.” (Hebrews 1:3a, NIV)

“The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.” (John 1:14, NIV)

As a follower of Jesus, you are a carrier of God’s glory.

“For God wanted them to know that the riches and glory of Christ are for you Gentiles, too. And this is the secret: Christ lives in you. This gives you assurance of sharing his glory.” (Colossians 1:27, NLT)

The difference between you and Moses:

- **God’s glory temporarily got on him.**
- **The glory of God permanently got in you.**

“And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord’s glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.” (2 Corinthians 3:18, NIV)

People ought to see more glory in me this year than they did last year.

1. Ponder God’s glory

2. Don’t let familiarity breed contempt.

Then I said, “It’s all over! I am doomed, for I am a sinful man. I have filthy lips, and I live among a people with filthy lips. Yet I have seen the King, the Lord of Heaven’s Armies.” (Isaiah 6:5, NLT)

Contemplating the glory of God should lead us to a high view of God.

3. Walk in humility.

We are to be like a wedding planner.

“For my own sake, for my own sake, I do this. How can I let myself be defamed? I will not yield my glory to another.” (Isaiah 48:11, NIV)

4. Serve with boldness.

“Therefore, since we have such a hope, we are very bold.” (2 Corinthians 3:12, NIV)
