- Why would God purposely use suffering as part of Paul's ministry for the sake of the church?
- How are Paul's afflictions "filling up what is lacking in Christ afflictions?"
- In what ways were Christ afflictions not lacking?
- How are we able to fill up what is lacking in Christ afflictions?
- What has Paul become a minister and Steward of? What does stewardship mean?
- What do you think Paul means when he says "fully known?"
- What is the mystery? Who is it revealed to? What does that tell us about the makeup of the church?
- What does the phrase "Christ in you, the hope of glory" reveal about Christian identity?
- What contrast do you see between present suffering and future glory?
