



## Beyond the Sermon

A Sermon Application Guide

Title: Align with the Promises

This guide offers a simple tool for those wanting to take the next step with this video message. You can print it to study on your own or use it in a group to experience transformation together.

### Message Theme

**The Architecture of a Renewed Mind:** Transforming your life by shifting from a "carnal" (sense-ruled) perspective to a "spiritual" (Word-ruled) perspective through the power of biblical meditation and the cleansing of the conscience.

### Key Truths

- **Meditation is Active:** It isn't just silent reflection; it involves "muttering" or speaking God's Word to yourself until it takes root in your "imagination" (inner conception).
- **Spirit vs. Senses:** Your feelings and five senses are "carnal" and often contradict God's truth. Faith requires "not considering" natural limitations.
- **The Conscience Must Be Cleansed:** You cannot walk in faith if you feel condemned. The blood of Jesus doesn't just forgive sin; it removes the "guilt-identity" of the sinner.
- **Thoughts Precede Reality:** Where the mind goes, the man follows. What you "conceive" in your deep thoughts will eventually manifest in your circumstances.

### Practical Applications

1. **Audit Your "Considerations":** Identify a problem you are currently facing (financial, physical, or emotional). Stop "Googling" the symptoms or staring at the bank balance. Instead, find a specific promise in the Bible that contradicts that problem and make it your primary focus.
2. **Practice "Muttering":** Choose one Scripture this week. Speak it out loud to yourself while driving, working, or cleaning. Use your voice to steer your mind away from "dread" and toward "hope."
3. **Silence the Accuser:** When a past mistake brings a feeling of "heaviness" or "distance from God," immediately declare that the blood of Jesus has cleansed your conscience. Refuse to identify as your past failure; identify as a "new creature."
4. **Visualize the Result:** In your prayer time, don't just ask for help—use your "sanctified imagination" to see yourself doing what the Word says you can do (e.g., being healthy, being generous, or being a leader).

### Declarations

- "I am not defined by my feelings; I am defined by the Word of God."
- "My conscience is clean, my past is gone, and I am the beloved of God."
- "I choose to consider God's promises more real than my problems."
- "I have the mind of Christ, and my imagination is filled with life and peace."

## Prayer Focus

- **Repentance:** Ask for forgiveness for dwelling on "unrighteous thoughts" or carnal reasoning rather than God's truth.
- **Identity:** Pray for a deeper revelation of what the blood of Jesus has truly done for your conscience.
- **Vision:** Ask the Holy Spirit to help you "conceive" (imagine) the victory God has for you in your current season.

*Heavenly Father, I come before You in the name of Jesus, intentionally choosing to align my thoughts with Your higher ways. I repent for the times I have allowed carnal reasoning, fear, and my five senses to dictate my reality instead of Your eternal Word. I ask for a deep, heart-level revelation of what the blood of Jesus has truly done for my conscience. I thank You that I am no longer defined by my past mistakes or the accusations of the enemy, but I am washed clean and justified in Your sight. I refuse to dwell on "dead works" and instead embrace my identity as a new creature, fully accepted in the Beloved and empowered to serve You with a clear and peaceful heart.*

*Holy Spirit, I ask for Your guidance as I practice the discipline of meditation, moving from a sense-ruled life to a Word-ruled life. Help me to "conceive" the victory You have for me in this current season, using my imagination to focus on Your promises of healing, provision, and peace rather than the problems surrounding me. I commit to staying my mind on You, trusting that as I mutter Your truth and keep my thoughts fixed on Your goodness, You will keep me in perfect peace. I declare that I am fully convinced that what You have promised, You are also able and willing to perform in my life today. In Jesus' name, Amen.*
