- 4. Do you sometimes struggle to accept that your "debt is paid in full"? Why or why not?
- 5. How can you live each day in gratitude for the finished work of Christ?

Write down one area of your life where you've been carrying guilt, shame,
or a sense of debt—and surrender it at the foot of the cross.
