Highlighted Scripture

1 Samuel 17:5

“He had a helmet of bronze on his head, and he was clothed with a coat of mail; and the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of bronze.”

1 Samuel 17:26

“Who is this uncircumcised Philistine, that he should defy the armies of the living God?”

1 Samuel 17:45

**“Then David said to the Philistine,
‘You come to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a javelin;
but I come to you in the name of the Lord of Hosts,
the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied.’”**

Discussion Questions

- 1. When you face a “giant,” do you focus more on its size — or on God’s power?**
- 2. Why do you think David never even called Goliath by name?**
- 3. What “armor” are you tempted to rely on instead of trusting God?**
- 4. How might your current challenges be preparing you for something greater?**
- 5. What would change if you truly believed, “The battle is the Lord’s”?**

Reflection Challenge

Identify one “giant” in your life — a fear, struggle, or obstacle.

Instead of naming the problem repeatedly, try naming God’s power over it.

Ask yourself:

- Am I measuring this battle by human strength or spiritual authority?**
- Have I been trained in smaller fields for this moment?**
- Am I stepping forward in faith or shrinking back?**

Remember:

- ✨ Giants look big when God looks small.**
- ✨ Preparation often happens in hidden seasons.**
- ✨ The battle belongs to the Lord.**
- ✨ Victory shifts courage — in you and in others.**

Help me see my battles the way David did.

Remind me that size does not determine victory — You do.

Strengthen me for the assignments ahead.

Teach me to rely on Your power, not my own.
