Highlighted Scriptures

Matthew 18:1–5 (NIV)

“At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, ‘Who, then, is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?’ He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them. And he said: ‘Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me.’”

Reflection Challenge

- Set aside one moment each day to pray with your family, even if it's short and simple.**
- Find ways to include God in your everyday conversations with your children.**
- Reflect on your own faith—are there ways you can return to the simplicity and trust of a childlike heart?**
