Discussion Questions

- 1. Why is it significant that Jesus said He came not for the healthy, but for the sick?
- 2. How do our weaknesses and "infirmities" allow God's strength to be made perfect in us?

- 3. Can you think of a trial in your life where you clearly saw God's presence or power?
- 4. In what ways does knowing your trials are "more precious than gold" change your perspective about suffering?
- 5. How can we extend the same grace and love toward others that Jesus has extended to us in our imperfections?

Reflection Challenge

- Reflect on an area of your life where you feel weak, broken, or "imperfect." Ask God to reveal how His power can shine through it.
- Write down one trial you're currently facing and how it might bring glory to Christ in the long run.
- Consider how you can encourage someone else this week who may be feeling "imperfect" or overlooked.

"Lord, thank You that Your grace is sufficient for me and that Your strength is made perfect in my weakness. Help me to see my trials as precious opportunities for You to be glorified.
