Highlighted Scripture

James 5:13–20 (KJV)

13 Is any among you afflicted? let him pray. Is any merry? let him sing psalms.

14 Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord:

15 And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him.

16 Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

17 Elias was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months.

18 And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth brought forth her fruit.

19 Brethren, if any of you do err from the truth, and one convert him;

20 Let him know, that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins.

Discussion Questions

1. According to James 5:13–20, what situations should lead us to pray?

- 2. Why do you think prayer is often underused by Christians, despite its power?**
- 3. How does Elijah's example encourage you about your own prayers?**
- 4. Who can you commit to pray for this week, and how might you let them know?**

Reflection Challenge

- **Choose one area in your life or someone else's life that needs God's touch—commit to praying for it daily this week.**
- **Start or renew a habit of daily conversation with God, even if it's just a few minutes at first.**
- **If possible, partner with another believer to pray together and hold each other accountable.**

Prayer Prompt

"Lord, thank You for the gift and power of prayer. Teach me to come to You daily with my needs, my praises, and my intercessions for others. Help me to pray with faith like Elijah, believing that You hear and answer. Bring healing, forgiveness, and revival to my life, my family, my church, and my nation. Stir up a hunger for prayer in Your people so that Your power and presence may be known. In Jesus' name, Amen."
