### **Highlighted Scripture**

**Hebrews 11:1**

**“Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.”**

**Hebrews 11:6**

**“And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.”**

### **Discussion Questions**

- 1. What does it mean for faith to be assurance and conviction, even when we cannot see the outcome?**
- 2. How does faith shape the way we approach God in prayer?**
- 3. What is the difference between trusting God and trying to control outcomes?**
- 4. What does it look like to diligently seek God, regardless of circumstances?**
- 5. How can we remain faithful when God's timing or answers look different than we expected?**

### **Reflection Challenge**

**Focus on deepening your trust in God—not just the outcomes you’re hoping for.**

**Ask yourself:**

- **Am I trusting God, or just hoping for a specific result?**
- **Do I still believe God is good, even when I don’t see immediate answers?**
- **Am I seeking God Himself, or only what He can provide?**

**Try this:**

**Spend time in prayer simply acknowledging who God is (not just asking for things)**

**Revisit a prayer you’ve been waiting on and surrender the outcome to God**

**Read Hebrews 11 and reflect on how faith was lived out through trust and obedience**

**Remember:**

**Faith is confidence in God’s character, not just expectation of results**

**God’s timing and answers are always purposeful**

**Seeking God is the reward—not just what He gives**

**True faith remains steady, even in uncertainty**

**Help me to grow in a faith that truly trusts You.**

**Teach me to rely on Your character, not just what I hope to receive.**

**Strengthen my heart to remain steady, even when I cannot see what You are doing.**
