Nothing Is Lost

Speaker: Pastor Tony Orihuela

Highlighted Scripture

- **Revelation 22:12–13**

"Behold, I am coming soon, bringing my recompense with me, to repay each one for what he has done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end."

Tony focuses on the word "recompense," using it to remind believers that Jesus sees our lives completely and that His return brings final justice and reward.

Discussion Questions

- **Revelation 22:12 says Jesus is coming with His recompense. What does this tell us about the fact that God sees how we live today?**
- **Why can regrets over past decisions or losses become so difficult to let go of?**
- **How does knowing that Christ is the "Alpha and the Omega,**

the first and the last" affect the way you view circumstances that currently feel unresolved?

- **Tony encourages listeners to stop living in "I wish I had..." thinking. Is there something from your past that you continually revisit with regret?**
- **How can the promise of Christ's return help us live faithfully today rather than remaining trapped by what has already happened?**

Reflection Challenge

Consider what you have been carrying from the past.

Ask yourself:

- **Am I continually grieving something I cannot go back and change?**
- **Have regret or disappointment become more powerful in my thinking than my hope in Christ?**
- **Am I living today with the awareness that Christ will return?**

Try this:

- **Read Revelation 22:12–13 and reflect on what Christ's return means for the way you live today.**
- **Bring one lingering regret before God instead of continuing to replay it.**
- **When you catch yourself thinking, "I wish I had...", turn that thought into a prayer of trust.**
- **Ask God to help you faithfully use what He has placed in**

your hands today rather than becoming consumed with what you have lost.

Remember

- **Jesus sees every part of our lives.**
- **Christ's return means that injustice and faithfulness will not ultimately go unnoticed.**
- **Our past regrets do not have to control how we live today.**
- **Jesus is the beginning and the end.**
- **Our ultimate hope is not recovering everything we've lost—it is Christ Himself.**

Prayer

Father God,

Thank You that nothing in my life escapes Your sight. You know every loss, disappointment, sacrifice, and regret I carry. Help me release the things I cannot change and trust You with what has been lost.

Keep my hope centered on Jesus and His return. Help me live faithfully today, knowing that Christ is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. Teach me to value what is eternal and trust Your perfect justice rather than allowing the regrets of yesterday to control me.
