Highlighted Scripture

Genesis 5:21–24

“When Enoch had lived sixty-five years, he fathered Methuselah. Enoch walked with God after he fathered Methuselah three hundred years and had other sons and daughters. Thus all the days of Enoch were three hundred sixty-five years. Enoch walked with God, and he was not, for God took him.”

Hebrews 11:5–6

“By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.”

Leviticus 26:3, 11–12

“If you walk in my statutes and observe my commandments and do them... I will make my dwelling among you, and my soul shall not abhor you. And I will walk among you and will be your God, and you shall be my people.”

John 14:15–16

“If you love me, you will keep my commandments.

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever.”

Exodus 33:11, 13–15

“Thus the Lord used to speak to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend...

Now therefore, if I have found favor in your sight, please show me now your ways, that I may know you...

And he said, ‘My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest.’

And he said to him, ‘If your presence will not go with me, do not bring us up from here.’”



Discussion Questions

- 1. In Genesis, many people are described as having lived, but Enoch is described as walking with God. What do you think makes the difference?**
- 2. Hebrews says that faith is necessary to please God. Why do you think faith alone is not meant to stop at belief, but lead into daily obedience?**
- 3. God promises His presence in Leviticus to those who walk in His ways. How does this challenge the idea that obedience is just about rules?**
- 4. Jesus connects love with obedience in John 14. How does this change the way you view following God’s commands?**
- 5. Moses valued God’s presence more than success, comfort, or progress. What does that teach us about what truly matters in our walk with God?**



Reflection Challenge

This week, reflect on what it means to walk with God:

Am I simply believing in God, or am I actively walking with Him each day?

Do my choices reflect a desire for His presence?

Am I willing to adjust my life to better follow His ways?
