



# GUIDED BIBLE STUDY

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## **Jesus Is the Door**

**Speaker: Pastor Tony Orihuela**

### **Highlighted Scripture**

**• John 10:9**

**"I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture."**

**Tony centers his message on Jesus' declaration that He is the door. Jesus is not simply someone who shows us where salvation is found—He Himself is the way through which we are saved and brought into the security and provision of God's people.**

**• John 14:6**

**"I am the way, the truth, and the life..."**

**Tony closes by connecting Jesus' description of Himself as the door with His declaration that He is the way, truth, and life. His central point is clear: salvation is found through Jesus Christ, not through an alternative path.**

## **Discussion Questions**

- **Why do you think Jesus chose the image of a door to describe Himself in John 10?**
- **Tony emphasizes that there is only one entrance into salvation. Why is Jesus Himself—not simply knowing about Jesus—central to the Christian Gospel?**
- **John 10:9 says those who enter through Jesus will "go in and out and find pasture." What does this tell us about the security, freedom, and provision found in Christ?**
- **Jesus says His sheep recognize the shepherd's voice. What helps us become more familiar with Christ's voice and teaching?**
- **Tony asks us to think differently the next time we walk through our own front door. How could an ordinary object like a door become a reminder of what Christ has done for us?**

## **Reflection Challenge**

**This week, allow something you see every day to remind you of Jesus.**

**Every time you walk through a door, remember Christ's words:**

**"I am the door."**

**Ask yourself:**

- **Am I trusting completely in Jesus for my salvation?**
- **Am I listening for and following the voice of my Shepherd?**

- **Have I begun treating the Gospel as something familiar instead of remembering how extraordinary it is?**
- **Is there someone in my life who needs to hear why my hope is found in Jesus?**

**Try this:**

- **Read John 10 and pay particular attention to how Jesus describes Himself and His relationship with His sheep.**
- **Thank Jesus specifically for the salvation you have received through Him.**
- **When you walk through your front door this week, pause for a moment and remember John 10:9.**
- **Look for a natural opportunity to tell someone why your hope is found in Christ.**

**Remember**

- **Jesus doesn't merely point toward salvation—salvation is found in Him.**
- **There is no alternative entrance into God's Kingdom.**
- **Jesus knows His sheep, and His sheep recognize His voice.**
- **In Christ we find salvation, security, freedom, and provision.**
- **Familiar truths are still worth remembering.**
- **Jesus is the door.**

## **Prayer**

**Father God,**

**Thank You for sending Jesus Christ to save us. Thank You that I don't have to search for another way to You, but can place my trust completely in Your Son.**

**Help me recognize the voice of my Shepherd and faithfully follow Him. When the Gospel begins to feel familiar, remind me again of how incredible it is that You have made a way for me to be reconciled to You.**

**Give me courage and compassion to share that hope with others, and let even the ordinary things around me remind me of the truth of who Jesus is.**
