Faithful to the Father

Highlighted Scripture

John 8:3-11 (NIV)

"The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group and said to Jesus, 'Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?' They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him.

But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, 'Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.' Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground.

At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there.

Jesus straightened up and asked her, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?'

'No one, sir,' she said.

'Then neither do I condemn you,' Jesus declared. 'Go now and leave your life of sin."

Discussion Questions

- 1. What stood out to you most in Jesus' response to the woman caught in adultery?
- 2. How can "spiritual adultery" happen in everyday life without us realizing it?
- 3. What things or habits in your life tend to take your focus off of God?
- 4. Why is Jesus' mercy such an important part of repentance and transformation?
- 5. What does it mean to be fully faithful to God in both thought and action?

Reflection Challenge

Take time this week to reflect on areas where you may be distracted or distant from God. Identify one thing that has been taking too much of your attention or affection, and surrender it to the Lord. Replace that time or habit with prayer, worship, or time in Scripture.

Ask God daily to help you remain faithful and keep your heart devoted entirely to Him.
