Highlighted Scriptures

Romans 10:12–17 (ESV)

For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.” How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!” But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, “Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?” So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Why do you think Paul emphasizes that there is “no distinction between Jew and Greek” in salvation?**
- 2. How does Romans 10:14–15 challenge us in our responsibility to share the gospel?**
- 3. What fears or excuses sometimes hold you back from sharing your testimony?**
- 4. Who in your life right now might need to hear what God has done for you personally?**

5. How does sharing your testimony bring glory to God?



Devotional Homework

- **Reflect on your personal testimony: Write down how Jesus saved you and how He has changed your life.**
- **Pray and ask God to put one person on your heart this week to share your testimony with.**
- **Begin with honesty and simplicity – you don't need a script, just your story.**
- **Meditate on Romans 10:17 and thank God that faith comes through hearing His Word.**



Prayer Prompt

“Lord Jesus, thank You that salvation is for everyone who calls on Your name. Give me courage to share my testimony, to speak honestly of what You’ve done in my life, and to trust that You will use my words to touch hearts. Open the ears of those who need to hear, and may Your gospel bring salvation and hope. Amen.”
