Connected to the Source

Highlighted Scripture

- **John 15:1–17 (especially verses 4–5, 6–7)**

Jesus teaches that He is the true vine and His followers are the branches. Those who abide in Him bear much fruit, but apart from Him they can do nothing. A branch disconnected from the vine withers, while those who remain in Christ receive the nourishment needed to live fruitful lives.

- **Matthew 28:19–20**

Tony concludes by reminding believers of the Great Commission—to go, make disciples, and share the Gospel with the world.

Discussion Questions

- **Tony's illustration shows that being close to the tree is not the same as being connected to it. What does that teach us about our relationship with Christ?**
- **According to John 15, what does it practically mean to "abide"**

in Jesus?

- **Tony says that attending church is important but not enough by itself. Why is a personal relationship with Christ essential?**
- **What habits help you stay connected to Christ throughout the week rather than only on Sundays?**
- **How does abiding in Christ prepare us to fulfill the Great Commission?**

Reflection Challenge

Focus on remaining connected to Christ—not just near Him.

Ask yourself:

- **Am I relying on a weekly church service, or am I cultivating a daily relationship with Jesus?**
- **What distractions are keeping me from abiding in Christ consistently?**
- **How can I intentionally stay connected to the true source of spiritual life?**

Try this:

- **Spend time with God every day this week through prayer and Scripture.**
- **Before beginning your day, ask Jesus to help you remain connected to Him in everything you do.**
- **Look for one opportunity to show Christ's love through an act of kindness or by sharing your faith.**

- **At the end of each day, reflect on how you experienced God's presence and guidance.**

Remember

- **Spiritual life comes from remaining connected to Christ.**
- **Being near Jesus is not the same as abiding in Him.**
- **Church gatherings strengthen our faith, but our relationship with Christ continues every day.**
- **A healthy relationship with Jesus produces spiritual fruit.**
- **As we abide in Christ, He equips us to share the Gospel with others.**

Thank You for inviting me into a living relationship with Jesus Christ. Help me not to settle for simply being close to You, but to remain deeply connected to You each day.
