🐆 Highlighted Scripture

Isaiah 41:10-16 (NIV)

"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

All who rage against you will surely be ashamed and disgraced; those who oppose you will be as nothing and perish.

Though you search for your enemies, you will not find them.

Those who wage war against you will be as nothing at all.

For I am the Lord your God who takes hold of your right hand and says to you, Do not fear; I will help you.

Do not be afraid, you worm Jacob, little Israel, do not fear, for I myself will help you," declares the Lord, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel.

"See, I will make you into a threshing sledge, new and sharp, with many teeth.

You will thresh the mountains and crush them and reduce the hills to chaff.

You will winnow them, the wind will pick them up, and a gale will blow

- 4. Can you recall a time when God gave you unexpected strength or peace in a difficult season?

#### Devotional Homework

- Read Isaiah 41:10-16 out loud and personalize it with your name.
- Write down one fear or worry you are holding onto and then pray, surrendering it to God.
- Whenever an anxious thought arises, pause and pray: "Lord, I trust You with this. Hold my hand."
- Share with a trusted friend or family member one way God has recently strengthened you.
