### Highlighted Scripture

**Isaiah 41:10–16 (NIV)**

**"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.**

**All who rage against you will surely be ashamed and disgraced; those who oppose you will be as nothing and perish.**

**Though you search for your enemies, you will not find them.**

**Those who wage war against you will be as nothing at all.**

**For I am the Lord your God who takes hold of your right hand and says to you, Do not fear; I will help you.**

**Do not be afraid, you worm Jacob, little Israel, do not fear, for I myself will help you," declares the Lord, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel.**

**"See, I will make you into a threshing sledge, new and sharp, with many teeth.**

**You will thresh the mountains and crush them and reduce the hills to chaff.**

**You will winnow them, the wind will pick them up, and a gale will blow**

**them away.**

- 2. How does the personal nature of God’s promises in Isaiah 41 encourage you?**
- 3. What practices (like prayer, Scripture, or worship) help you refocus on God’s presence when anxiety creeps in?**
- 4. Can you recall a time when God gave you unexpected strength or peace in a difficult season?**



## **Devotional Homework**

- Read Isaiah 41:10–16 out loud and personalize it with your name.**
- Write down one fear or worry you are holding onto and then pray, surrendering it to God.**
- Whenever an anxious thought arises, pause and pray: “Lord, I trust You with this. Hold my hand.”**
- Share with a trusted friend or family member one way God has recently strengthened you.**

**Lord, in times of uncertainty, remind me that You are holding my hand. Thank You for being my strength, my helper, and my peace. I choose to trust You with the unknown and rest in Your presence. Amen.**
