Highlighted Scripture

1 Corinthians 3:6–7 (NLT)

I planted the seed in your hearts, and Apollos watered it, but it was God who made it grow.

It's not important who does the planting, or who does the watering. What's important is that God makes the seed grow.

Galatians 6:9 (NLT)

So let's not get tired of doing what is good. At just the right time we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't give up.

Discussion Questions

- 1. The speaker said it's hard not to feel responsible for the salvation of those we love. Why do you think that burden is so heavy for believers?**
- 2. What is the difference between faithfulness and outcomes, and why does God only ask us for one of those?**
- 3. The speaker reminded us that waiting and silence do not mean God isn't working. How does that truth help you when prayers seem unanswered?**
- 4. What does it look like to release someone back into God's hands after you've prayed, spoken, and loved them well?**
- 5. Who is the "one" person God has placed in front of you right now, and how can you be faithful without carrying the weight of results?**

Reflection Challenge

This week, practice faithfulness without forcing outcomes.

Ask yourself:

- **Am I trusting God with what only He can do?**
- **Am I loving and praying without trying to control results?**
- **Can I rest, knowing God is at work even when I can't see it?**
