Stones of Remembrance and Steps of Faith

Highlighted Scripture

• **Joshua 4**

After Israel crossed the Jordan River, God instructed twelve men to take stones from the riverbed and build a memorial. These stones would serve as a reminder of God's power and faithfulness and would help future generations understand what God had done.

Discussion Questions

- **Why do you think God instructed Israel to build a memorial after crossing the Jordan?**
- **What role does remembering God's past work play in helping us obey Him today?**
- **Have you ever felt God leading you to do something uncomfortable or difficult?**
- **How does fear often affect our willingness to follow God's**

direction?

- **What "stones of remembrance" can you point to in your own life that remind you of God's faithfulness?**

Reflection Challenge

Instead of focusing only on remembering God's faithfulness, focus on how those memories can strengthen your obedience.

Ask yourself:

- **Is there an area where God is calling me to take a step of faith?**
- **What past experience proves that God has been faithful to me?**
- **How can I use that experience to trust Him with my current situation?**

Try this:

- **Write down three moments where God clearly provided, protected, or guided you.**
- **Create your own "memorial stone" by recording those moments in a journal.**
- **The next time fear or uncertainty arises, revisit those reminders before making a decision.**
- **Ask God to help you move forward in obedience rather than retreat in fear.**

Remember

- **God often prepares us for future challenges by reminding us of past victories.**
- **Memorials help keep God's faithfulness fresh in our minds.**
- **Fear grows when we focus on the obstacle.**
- **Faith grows when we focus on God's track record.**
- **Obedience becomes easier when we remember who is leading us.**
