Highlighted Scripture

• Isaiah 55:8–9

God reminds His people that His thoughts and ways are higher than ours. What seems confusing from our perspective is fully understood by Him.

Discussion Questions

- Why do we often want God to reveal the entire plan before we are willing to move forward?**
- How does Isaiah 55:8–9 help us understand why we cannot always see what God is doing?**
- Have you ever experienced a situation where God only gave you enough direction for the next step?**
- What is the difference between trusting God for today and worrying about tomorrow?**
- How might your relationship with God change if you learned**

to depend on Him daily instead of demanding certainty about the future?

Reflection Challenge

Focus on trusting God with today instead of trying to solve tomorrow.

Ask yourself:

- **Am I spending more time worrying about the future than being faithful today?**
- **What next step has God already made clear to me?**
- **Am I waiting for complete certainty before obeying?**

Try this:

- **Identify one area where you've been seeking answers about the future.**
- **Instead of focusing on the final outcome, ask God to show you the next faithful step.**
- **When anxious thoughts arise, remind yourself that God already sees what you cannot.**
- **Spend time thanking God for today's provision instead of worrying about tomorrow's needs.**

Remember

- **God often provides daily guidance rather than long-range explanations.**
- **Faith grows when we trust God one day at a time.**

- **We do not need tomorrow's answers to obey today.**
- **God's perspective is greater than our own.**
- **Obedience begins with the next step, not the entire roadmap.**

Prayer

Father God,

Thank You for seeing the entire picture when I can only see a small part of it. Help me trust You when I don't understand what lies ahead. Teach me to depend on You daily instead of worrying about the future. Give me the courage to take the next step You have placed before me and the wisdom to trust Your timing.
