## Mature Love: Embracing God's Narrative When Mistreated

## I. INTRODUCTION

- A. As we cultivate agreement with God's perspective of the people who mistreat we can enjoy mature love and family unity with joy.
- B. David was tending sheep without any accomplishments yet
  - <sup>7</sup>For the <u>LORD does not see as man sees</u>; for man looks at [focuses on] the <u>outward appearance</u>, but the <u>LORD looks at the heart</u>. (1 Sam. 16:7)
  - <sup>5</sup><u>Judge nothing before the time</u>, until the Lord comes...[to] reveal the <u>counsels of the hearts</u>. Then <u>each one's praise will come from God</u>. (1 Cor. 4:5)
- C. *Outward appearance*: This includes "the facts" about 5-10 of their *main accomplishments*, 5-10 of their *failures* and 5-10 of their *deficiencies* (in their personality or leadership skills)
- D. These **facts** do matter, but are not the *primary determining factors* in God's narrative for people.
- E. The divine narrative is based on the profound reality that the Lord sees not as man sees.
- F. **Divine narrative**: He looks at His **sovereign call** on them, their **sincere motives** (seen in their countless 10 second thoughts or conversation with God that reveal their intention to obey) and His interpretation of their **main accomplishments**, **failures** and **deficiencies** 
  - <sup>14</sup>The LORD has sought for Himself <u>a man after His own heart</u>, and the LORD has commanded him to be commander over His people. (1 Sam. 13:14)
- G. Our goal is to engage in "the right conversation" the one that promotes God's narrative in people's lives and thus advances mature love with family unity and joy
  - <sup>20</sup>He [Abraham] did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief.... (Rom. 4:20)
  - <sup>22</sup>He raised up David...concerning whom He testified and said, 'I have found David...a man after My heart, who will do all My will'...<sup>36</sup>For David, after he had served the purpose of God in his own generation, fell asleep [died]... (Acts 13:22, 36; NAS)

Gen. 12 Abraham lied about Sarah to Pharaoh and he weary of waiting so he had a son with Hagar

Gen. 16 Hagar was Abraham's concubine and the mother of his son Ishmael.
