Deuteronomy 33:26 NKJV — “There is no one like the God of Jeshurun, who rides the heavens to help you, and his excellency on the clouds. The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms.

God is omnipresent-everywhere, completely surrounding us

Ephesians 4:6 NKJV — One God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in you all

God doesn't just leave you hanging there, for underneath are His “everlasting arms”

The underneath must be firm, for it that fails, then everything will fail

The Church of Jesus Christ is secured by a savior who will never pass away.

How is the “underneath” in your life? Is it secured by the everlasting arms of Jesus?

Colossians 1:16-17 NLT — for through him God created everything in the heavenly realms and on earth. He made the things we can see and the things we can't see— such as thrones, kingdoms, rulers, and authorities in the unseen world. Everything was created through him and for him. He existed before anything else, and he holds all creation together.

Psalms 91:11-12 NKJV — For He shall give His angels charge over you, To keep you in all your ways. In their hands they shall bear you up, Lest you dash your foot against a stone

Discussion Questions

1. God is “omnipresent, everywhere, completely surrounding us.” Has there ever been a time in your life where you felt that God was not with you?
2. God’s everlasting arms are underneath us, according to Deuteronomy. Do you feel like God is always supporting you? If / When you do not feel like this, what do you think may be the cause?
3. Pastor Brett says that walls, carpet, and paint may move and be changed, but the foundation underneath stays the same. What is the foundation underneath your life?
4. When you feel worried, anxious, or in danger, what is your go-to response? Do you pray Psalm 91:11 over your life — “For he shall give His angels charge over you, to keep you in all your ways. In their hands they shall bear you up, lest you dash your foot against a stone?”
