TODDLERS AND EARLY PRE-K (AGES 1-3)



September 27, 2020

Bible Words: "Trust the LORD with all your heart." Proverbs 3:5, NCV Noah • Genesis 6:8-

Bottom Line: God keeps His promises.

Basic Truth: God loves me.

Story Time

Gather children on a rug or in a specific area of the classroom to tell the story. Some kids (especially the younger ones) may wander. That's okay. They're still listening and learning!

What You Need: Preschool Bible

LEADER: "Hello, friends! Come sit over here with me. It's time to hear our TRUE story straight from the Bible. (*Hold up Bible.*) Today I want to tell you a story about a man named Noah.

"One day, God told Noah to build a really, really, REALLY (stretch arms out wide) big boat called an ark. He had never seen a boat that big before. But Noah trusted God and built the ark just like God told him to. Let's pretend we're like Noah building that ark. Quick, everyone cut the wood like this. (Move your arm in a sawing motion.)

"God wanted Noah to fill the ark with two of every animal—one boy and one girl. Can you tell me some animals? (*Pause*) Yes! All of those animals were on the ark. There were elephants and lions and birds and zebras. Let's pretend to be an elephant. Show me your trunk! (*Demonstrate.*) Now, can you be a lion? (*Roar.*) Those are great animals.

"After all the animals were on board the ark, God told Noah to get his family and go inside the ark, and then God closed the door. And that was a good thing, because it soon began to rain! Pat your hands on your legs like this (pat your legs) to make a rain sound.

"At first, it was just a few drops of rain. But there was more (pat legs faster) and more and more. (Pat legs even faster.)

"Okay, you can stop patting. It rained for 40 days and 40 nights until the WHOLE world was covered in water. Noah and his family were kept safe on the ark, though, because Noah believed God's promise.

"Finally, the water went down, and land began to appear. God told Noah, 'It's safe now. You can come out of the ark and bring all the animals with you.' God kept them safe just like He promised. And then God made a rainbow! The rainbow was a sign of the promise between God and every living creature that God would never flood the whole earth again. I love it when I see a rainbow, because it helps me remember that **[Bottom Line]** God keeps His promises."

Craft Time

Gather small groups of children around you at a table for toddler craft time. Depending on the size of your group, you may lead the craft two or three times. Not every child may want to participate in craft time. That's okay. Feel free to send home the craft materials for them to complete with their mom or dad.

What You Need: "Ark" and "Animals" Activity Pages, white paper, glue sticks, crayons *(optional)*

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Copy "Ark" and "Animals" Activity Pages and cut on the dotted lines. Each child needs one ark and one set of animals.

During the Activity: Retell the story as the children glue the animals on the ark.

What You Say:

During the Activity: "Today we learned about a man named Noah. One day, God told Noah to build a really big boat called an ark. Noah trusted God and built the ark just like God told him to.

"God wanted Noah to fill the ark with two of every animal. There were elephants and lions and birds and zebras and every other kind of animal. After all the animals were on


board the ark, God told Noah to get his family and to go inside the ark, and then God closed the door. Then it started to rain and rain and rain.


"Look at your paper. I see the ark! And here are a bunch of animals. Let's get all the animals on the ark. Awesome job!

"God kept Noah safe on the ark and then sent a rainbow to remind us that **[Bottom Line]** God keeps His promises."




