**Bottom Line:** The Bible tells me which way to go.

Basic Truth: God made me. God loves me. Jesus wants to be my friend forever.

## **Story Time**

Meet with your child on a rug or in a specific area of your home to tell the story. Some kids (especially the younger ones) may wander. That's okay. They're still listening and learning!

What You Need: Preschool Bible, butcher paper, and marker

**Say:** "This is the Bible. (*Hold up Bible.*) It has God's words in it. God gave us the Bible to show us which way to go. We love the Bible. (*Give Bible a hug.*)

"Do you want to hold the Bible? (Let your child hold the Bible. Encourage them to say, "This is the Bible and it's God's words for me.")

The Bible has God's words in it, and it tells us which way to go kind of like an arrow. (*Draw arrow.*) The Bible tells us the direction to go and the right decision to make. That makes it very, very special. It tells us to love each other. (*Draw a heart.*) The Bible also tells us to share things with our friends. When we share, we make people happy. (*Draw smiley face.*) We can share our toys and games with our friends. The Bible tells us to pray. Praying is talking to God. (*Draw praying hands if you are able or draw a mouth.*) Put your hands like this, and we'll pray. (*Demonstrate praying hands.*) Dear God, thank You for giving us the Bible to tell us which way to go. We love You, God. In Jesus' name, amen.

## **Craft Time- Bookmark**

**What You Need:** "Bookmark" Activity Page, stamp pad, wet wipes; you may use washable markers instead of a stamp pad/

## What You Do:

Before the Activity: Copy "Bookmark"

During the Activity: Retell the story as your child uses their fingerprints to fill the hearts on the page. A stamp pad will work best, but washable markers on fingertips works as well.

## What You Say:


During the Activity: "Today we learned about the Bible. The Bible has God's words in it, and it tells us which way to go. That makes it very, very special. Can you say the word 'Bible' at the count of three? One, two, three, Bible. Great job!

"Whose words are in the Bible? (*Pause.*) God's Words are in the Bible, and they are always true. [Bottom Line] The Bible tells me which way to go.

"The Bible tells us to love each other. The Bible also tells us to share things with our friends. And the Bible tells us to pray to God by talking to Him.

"Look at your paper. This is a bookmark. You can put it in your Bible to mark the page you want to read next. Look, it has a Bible on the bottom. What are these things above the Bible? Yes, they're hearts. Let's fill the hearts with our fingerprints.
