WEEK #1 - APRIL 19

Big Idea of the Sermon

Leadership starts with knowing who you are in Christ.

Scriptures Covered in the Sermon

Primary: 2 Corinthians 5:17

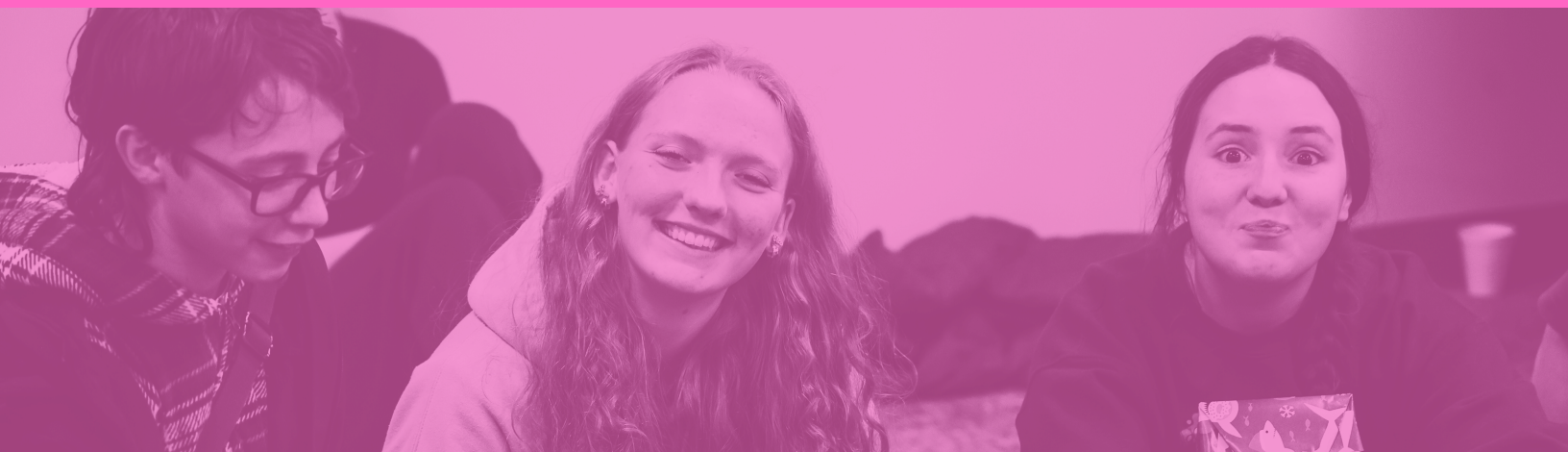
Supporting: 1 John 3:1, Romans 8:11

Overview of the Sermon

This week, we kicked off our Influencer series by challenging the idea that influence comes from followers, fame, or popularity. Students explored how real influence actually begins with identity, specifically, knowing who they are in Christ. In 2 Corinthians 5:17, they saw that following Jesus means becoming a new creation, not just a better version of themselves. We unpacked three key truths: identity is given, not earned; their past does not define their future; and their worth is already established by God. Through 1 John 3:1, students were reminded they are children of God, and in Romans 8:11, they learned that God's Spirit lives in them. The goal was simple: help students begin living from who God says they are, not what the world says.

A Thought for the Home

Your student is constantly hearing messages about who they should be, your voice matters more than you think. Regularly speak truth over them about their identity in Christ, not just their performance or behavior.



WEEK #1 - APRIL 12

Discipleship @ Home

Have your student write down one lie they've believed about themselves (ex: "I'm not enough") and replace it with a truth from Scripture (ex: "I am God's child" - 1 John 3:1). Put it somewhere visible (mirror, phone background, etc.).

Continue the Conversation

- Read 2 Corinthians 5:17 together. What do you think it means to be a "new creation" in your everyday life?
- What are some messages students your age hear about identity or worth that don't line up with what God says?
- Do you think it's hard to let go of past mistakes even when you know you're forgiven? Why?
- What's one situation this week where you can choose to live from your identity in Christ instead of what others think?

Prayer Prompts for Your Student

- That they would truly believe they are a child of God and deeply loved.
- That they would recognize and replace lies about their identity with God's truth.
- That they would release any shame or guilt from their past.
- That they would live confidently in who God created them to be.
