WEEK #2 - APRIL 19

Big Idea of the Sermon

Your influence comes from who you are, not just what you do.

Scriptures Covered in the Sermon

1 Timothy 4:12, Titus 2:7-8, Galatians 5:22-23, James 1:22

Overview of Sermon

This message challenged students to understand that they already have influence, regardless of their age, and that real influence is not built on popularity, platforms, or performance, but on character. Through Paul's encouragement to Timothy and Titus, students were reminded that their lives are their message and that what they say must be backed up by how they live. True influence flows from a life shaped by the Holy Spirit, and that produces fruit. Ultimately, students were challenged to live with integrity, meaning their private life matches their public life, and to take practical steps this week to align their daily actions with their faith so others can clearly see Jesus through them.

A Thought for the Home

Don't just correct behavior, help your student connect their actions back to their identity in Christ. The goal isn't perfection, but consistency between what they believe and how they live.



WEEK #2 - APRIL 19

Disciple @ Home

At some point this week, ask your student: “Where do you feel like your life doesn’t match what you believe right now?” and share one of your own honestly as well to model integrity and openness.

Continue the Conversation

- Where do you feel like people your age don’t take you seriously, and how does that affect the way you live or lead?
- If someone watched your life closely this week, what would they say matters most to you based on your actions?
- What is one area where your actions don’t fully match your faith right now, and what makes that area difficult?
- What is one specific step you could take this week to better reflect Jesus in your everyday life?

Prayer Prompts for Your Student

- Pray that your student would understand their identity in Christ and have confidence that they can lead and influence others right now.
- Pray that the Holy Spirit would grow spiritual fruit in their life, especially in areas where they struggle.
- Pray that they would have courage to live with integrity, even when no one is watching.
- Pray that their life would clearly reflect Jesus and draw others toward Him.
