This guide helps you apply what we're learning at New Life Church to your weekly rhythms. Use it to engage in daily Bible reading, have meaningful conversations with your group, and take clear next steps in following Jesus.

WEEKLY SUMMARY

This week brought four seven-minute messages from Savannah, Cody, Katie, and Mitchell, each showing a different name of God and a different way His character changes how we live. Savannah preached Jehovah Tsidkenu, the Lord our Righteousness, reminding us that Jesus covers our sin and transforms us to live righteously. Cody preached Jehovah Mekoddishkem, the Lord who sanctifies, calling us to live set apart in our daily choices. Katie pointed to Jehovah Shalom, the Lord our Peace, reminding us that true peace comes through relationship with Jesus. Mitchell closed with Jehovah Jireh, the Lord who provides, showing through Abraham and Isaac that God sees, keeps His promises, and has already given us the ultimate provision in Jesus.

KEY SCRIPTURES

GROUP DISCUSSION



Use these questions to walk through the four messages in the order they were preached: Savannah, Cody, Katie, then Mitchell.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

SAVANNAH - JEHOVAH TSIDKENU

- Jeremiah 23:5-6 points to the coming King called The LORD Our Righteousness. Where do you tend to depend on your own goodness instead of receiving the righteousness Jesus gives?
- 2 Corinthians 5:21 says we become the righteousness of God in Christ. What part of your daily life needs to be transformed to look more like Jesus?

CODY - JEHOVAH MEKODDISHKEM

- Exodus 31:13 says God gave the Sabbath so His people would know He makes them holy. What habits or priorities reveal whether you are set apart for God?
- Leviticus 20:8 connects obedience with God's sanctifying work. What step of obedience may feel uncomfortable but would make Christ visible to others?

KATIE - JEHOVAH SHALOM

- Judges 6:24 names God as The LORD is Peace. Where are you searching for peace apart from relationship with Jesus?
- Romans 5:1 says we have peace with God through Jesus Christ. How should that change the way you handle anxiety, conflict, or pressure?

MITCHELL - JEHOVAH JIREH

- Genesis 22 shows Abraham obeying while trusting God to provide. What are you tempted to withhold from God because you are afraid He will not provide?
- Romans 8:32 points us to the ultimate provision of Jesus. How does the cross strengthen your trust while you wait for provision?

WEEKLY CHALLENGE

Choose one name of God from this week's messages and put it into practice. To Know God, read the Scripture connected to that name. To Find Freedom, surrender the sin, pressure, fear, or false source of peace connected to it. To Discover Purpose, ask God where He is setting you apart or inviting you to trust Him. To Make a Difference, encourage one person with the truth that God is righteous, holy, peaceful, and faithful to provide.

PRAYER GUIDE

Father, thank You for revealing Yourself to us. You are Jehovah Tsidkenu, our righteousness; Jehovah Mekoddishkem, the One who makes us holy; Jehovah Shalom, our peace; and Jehovah Jireh, our provider. Help us seek You first, live set apart, receive Your peace, and trust Your provision. Make our homes, workplaces, schools, and relationships places where Your character is seen. In Jesus' name, amen.

CLOSING THOUGHT

"Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." - Romans 5:1

Because of Jesus, we do not have to manufacture righteousness, holiness, peace, or provision on our own. The God who calls us also transforms us, calms us, and provides what we need as we follow Him.
