HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

As disciples, we're called not just to be informed but to be transformed into people who look more like Jesus—in our homes, our workplaces, and our communities. This guide helps you apply what we're learning at New Life Church to your weekly rhythms. Use it to engage in daily Bible reading, have meaningful conversations with your group, and take clear next steps in following Jesus.

WEEKLY SUMMARY

This final week of seven-minute messages revealed four names of God that meet us in every part of discipleship. Isaac preached **Jehovah Saboath**, the LORD of Hosts, the King of Glory who commands heaven's armies and calls His people to say yes to building His Church. Barry shared **Jehovah Tsuri**, the Rock, teaching us to stop trying to carry life in our own strength and make Christ our fortress, endurance, and grounding place. Wade preached **Jehovah Rohi**, our personal Shepherd, who knows our names, walks with us through every valley, and provides what we truly need. Leah closed with **El Roi**, the God Who Sees Me, reminding us that God meets us in the wilderness, uses our pain, and changes everything when we know we are fully seen.

KEY SCRIPTURES

GROUP DISCUSSION



Use these questions to walk through the four messages in the order they were preached: Isaac, Barry, Wade, then Leah.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

ISAAC - JEHOVAH SABOATH

- **Psalm 24:7-10** declares that the LORD of Hosts is strong, mighty in battle, and the King of glory. What battle are you tempted to carry as though the outcome depends entirely on you?
- **Romans 10** and **Matthew 28** show that God sends His people to help build His Church and make disciples. What "yes" might your Commander be asking from you?

BARRY - JEHOVAH TSURI

- Barry described the pressure of trying to be "the rock" for everyone else. Where has self-reliance added stress or kept others from seeing the real Rock?
- **Philippians 4:13** points to endurance and faithfulness, not simply achievement. How would your response to success, failure, or loss change if Christ were truly enough?

WADE - JEHOVAH ROHI

- **Psalm 23** says, "The LORD is my shepherd." How does knowing God is sovereign not only over all things but in all things reshape the valley you are walking through?
- **John 10** says the Shepherd knows His sheep by name. Where do you need to trust His presence, provision, guidance, or protection today?

LEAH - EL ROI

- **Genesis 16** shows God meeting Hagar in the wilderness. Where have you felt unseen, overlooked, or alone, and what would it mean to believe God meets you there?
- Leah taught that God uses our pain and that being seen changes everything. How can receiving God's care change the way you understand your story and see someone else this week?

WEEKLY CHALLENGE

Live under all four names this week. To **Know God**, read Psalm 24, Psalm 18, Psalm 23, and Genesis 16. To **Find Freedom**, surrender one battle, pressure, valley, or hidden hurt to God. To **Discover Purpose**, say yes to one step your Commander is asking you to take. To **Make a Difference**, intentionally notice one person who may feel unseen and remind them that God knows their name and is near.

PRAYER GUIDE

Father, You are Jehovah Saboath, the King of Glory; Jehovah Tsur, our Rock; Jehovah Rohi, our Shepherd; and El Roi, the God who sees us. Forgive us for fighting in our own strength, trying to carry everyone, wandering from Your voice, or believing we are unseen. Ground us in Christ, guide us through every valley, and give us courage to say yes to Your mission. Help us see and serve the people around us. In Jesus' name, amen.

CLOSING THOUGHT

"The LORD of hosts, he is the King of glory!" - Psalm 24:10

The King of Glory commands heaven, but He is not distant. He is the Rock beneath us, the Shepherd beside us, and the God who sees us in every wilderness. Our response is obedient trust: lean on Him, follow His voice, and say yes.
