Day 1: The Great Commission Reading: Matthew 28:16-20 Devotional: Jesus' final command to His disciples was to go and make disciples of all nations. This wasn't a suggestion, but a commandment. As we reflect on this passage, let's consider our role in fulfilling the Great Commission. Are we actively sharing the Gospel in our daily lives? Are we supporting those who go to unreached people groups? Today, pray for opportunities to share God's love with someone in your sphere of influence, and consider how you can support global missions efforts.

Day 2: Stewardship of God's Resources Reading: 1 Corinthians 4:1-2, Matthew 25:14-30 Devotional: Everything we have belongs to God - our time, talents, and treasures. We are merely stewards of what He has entrusted to us. How are we using these resources to further God's kingdom? Are we investing in eternal things or temporary pleasures? Today, take inventory of your resources and prayerfully consider how you can better steward them for God's glory and the advancement of His mission.

Day 3: The Heart of Giving Reading: 2 Corinthians 9:6-15 Devotional: God loves a cheerful giver. Our giving should flow from a heart of gratitude and love for God, not out of obligation or for recognition. When we give generously, we participate in God's work and experience His abundant provision. Reflect on your attitude towards giving. Are you giving out of joy or duty? Ask God to cultivate a generous spirit within you and trust in His promise to supply all your needs.

Day 4: Eternal Perspective Reading: Colossians 3:1-4, Matthew 6:19-21 Devotional: As believers, we're called to set our minds on things above, not on earthly things. This means prioritizing what has eternal value over temporary pleasures or achievements. Are we living with eternity in mind? Are we investing in people's souls rather than accumulating worldly possessions? Today, ask God to shift your perspective and help you focus on what truly matters in light of eternity.

Day 5: Answering God's Call Reading: Isaiah 6:1-8, Acts 1:8 Devotional: When Isaiah encountered God's holiness, his response was "Here am I. Send me!" Similarly, Jesus promised His disciples power through the Holy Spirit to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth. God is still calling people today to participate in His mission. Are we listening for His voice? Are we willing to go wherever He sends us - whether across the street or across the world? Spend time in prayer, asking God to reveal how He wants to use you in His mission. Be open to His leading, whether it's to pray, give, or go.
