- Romans 2:5
- "O Lord, in whose hands are life and death, by whose power I am sustained, and by whose mercy I am spared—look down upon me with pity. Forgive me that I have until now so much neglected the duty which you have assigned to me, and suffered the days and hours of which I must give account to pass away without any endeavor to accomplish your will. Make me to remember, O God, that ever day is your gift, and ought to be used according to your command. Grant me, therefore, so to repent of my negligence, that I may obtain mercy from you, and pass the time which you shall yet allow me in diligent performance of your commands, through Jesus Christ, Amen.

God's Provision

Psalm 111

- 1) Read Psalm 103:1-2. The Psalmist is talking to his own soul and instructing it to bless the Lord and not forget all of His benefits. Do you ever have to instruct your soul to slow down and worship?
- 2) Israel regularly reminded themselves of God's faithfulness in their past as a way of hope for His present and future faithfulness. How can we regularly make this a practice in our own lives?
- 3) Read Psalm 111.
- 4) In this week's message, Pastor Daniel said that God delights in providing for His children. What does this tell us about God and His character?
- 5) Psalm 111 tells us that God spiritually provides for His children through salvation, covenant relationship, and His Word. What does this look like in our lives, as believers, and how can we delight in God through His spiritual provision?

- 6) Psalm 111 also tells us that God physically provides for His children. How have you seen God providentially care for your physical needs?
- 7) Have there been times when you have doubted God's ability or desire to provide for your needs? How do you fight against that and press deeper into faith?
- 8) What is one thing God taught you through this passage and sermon?
