BIBLE READING

Read: 1 Samuel 1-2; 1 Samuel 3; 8; 1 Samuel 9-10; 1 Samuel 13-14; 1 Samuel 15-16

Memorize: 1 Samuel 15:22; 16:7

PRAYER GUIDE

First of all, then, I urge that entreaties and prayers, petitions and thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men, for kings and all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and one mediator also between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave Himself as a ransom for all, the testimony given at the proper time (1 Timothy 2:1-6).

Sunday, April 10 — Pray that the people in your church family will walk with an assurance of their salvation, knowing that he who has the Son has the life (1 John 5:12).

Monday, April 11 — Since He always lives to make intercession for those who receive the gift of eternal life, Jesus is able to save forever those who draw near to God through Him (Hebrews 7:25). Thank God for the eternal nature of Christ's salvation and His ongoing commitment to pray for us as God's children.

Tuesday, April 12 — The Greek word used in 1 Timothy 2:1 for prayers is the most often-used word for prayer in the New Testament. It describes an open, two-way communication God desires to have with us. Pray that we will be alert to His voice as He prompts us to pray for the lost we encounter daily.

Wednesday, April 13 — Pray that those in your community who are looking for eternal life through something other than faith in Jesus will quickly discover that there is salvation in no one else (Acts 4:12).

Thursday, April 14 — Some people teach that salvation comes partially or totally through good deeds and religious efforts. Pray that where the gospel is presented in your community, people will understand that just the opposite is true: Salvation is a gracious gift of God received by faith (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Friday, April 15 — The devil loves to blind the minds of the unbelieving so they can't see the truth about Jesus (2 Corinthians 4:4). Pray that the lost in your community will have their spiritual eyes opened and will respond in faith to the truth of the gospel.

Saturday, April 16 — Pray that the lost around you will not fall under the deception of wickedness but will receive the love of the truth so as to be saved (2 Thessalonians 2:10).
