- 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

God's Promises

Romans 8:18-39

- 1) Read Romans 8:18-39.
- 2) How does the truth that “God is for us” change the way you view life?
- 3) In Romans 8:18-39 Paul details how the Triune God is at work for His people. God the Spirit is eternally for us as He is our assurance of future redemption. In what ways have you experienced the Spirit’s assurance in your life?
- 4) The Holy Spirit also intercedes for us with “groaning too deep for words.” What does this mean and how does this change your own prayer life?
- 5) Paul tells us that God works out all things for the good in the lives of those who love Him. How can this promise be misunderstood and what is the result? What is the good that Paul is referring to and how does this change the way we see hardship, trial, and suffering?
- 6) Paul says that God—who did not spare His own Son—will give us all things. What does he mean by this and how does this give us assurance?

- 7) Read 1 John 2:1-2.

How does Satan try to accuse and condemn believers? How does the work of Christ assure us that Satan can never successfully accuse or condemn the people of God?
- 8) What does Paul mean when he says that we are “more than conquerors through Christ Jesus?”
- 9) How does this passage encourage you to trust in God’s providence? How does this passage convict you to change the way you live?
