Parson to Person

The year was 2020. It was the year of COVID-19. The world was on lock-down. Supplies were scarce. I remember that stores limited the amount one could get, especially when it came to toilet paper. My goodness, how times have changed.

China started this whole thing back in 589 A.D. Well, that was the first time someone wrote about it. It wasn't until 1857 that Joseph Gayetty introduced what is considered modern toilet paper. It was the Scott Paper Company that began marketing toilet paper on a roll back in 1890. Admittedly, one's plumbing situation had a lot to do with their particular type of hygiene product they used. But at sometime in the 1950's and somewhere in the South a group of teenagers flung toilet paper into trees, probably after a football win. Thus began a fall tradition like no other. This may have come from Auburn, Alabama. Back before the Auburn Tigers had their games broadcast over the radio, one would telegraph the only establishment in Auburn that had a telegraph machine, Toomer's Drugs Pharmacy. When the employees found out that Auburn had won the game, they would throw ticker tape over their power lines. By the 1960's, Auburn fans began to roll the power lines and the trees outside the Pharmacy every time they won a football game. Such a fun thing could not be kept in one little Southern town.

Growing up we called it "rolling yards." When I went to seminary in Texas, they called it "TP-ing." In both places, flinging toilet paper into trees was reserved for Halloween. When I moved back to Mississippi in 1994, the entire month of October was rolling yard month. When I was pastor at Mantee, the parsonage got rolled so bad so many times that I just left the toilet paper there until I mowed the melted clumps in the Spring.

There is no specific law in Mississippi that makes the act of rolling someone's yard illegal. That said, one could be charged with harassment which, if found guilty, carries a \$500 fine and up to 90 days in jail. Also, one could be charged with trespassing which, if found guilty, carries a \$500 fine and up to 6 months in jail. Also, one could be charged with vandalism which, if found guilty, carries a \$1,000 fine, 12 months in jail, restitution, and a year probation.

And with all of the cameras out there—the cameras of the yard you are rolling, the cameras across the street, next door, and game cameras hidden in trees-the likelihood of being found guilty is pretty good. Also, your friends bragging will give it away.

I think it is fine to roll yards. If your child is going to roll yards, then you should expect your yard to get rolled without you getting mad. If your child is going to roll yards, then they should pick up the toilet paper out of your yard when it gets rolled.

I also think you should be careful whose yard you roll. Some people have a short fuse. They may be dealing with things you don't know about. They could press charges or worse. If you are going to roll yards, you need to roll yards of people that you like and who like you. Also, any vandalism is unacceptable. If you accidentally break something while rolling a yard, immediately notify the people and accept responsibility to fix what you broke.

It's October, y'all. It's October 2025. We no longer need to hoard toilet paper like we did in 2020. Be safe. Have fun.
