Parson to Person

Black Hawk Down is a 2002 movie about the real life U.S. Army operation gone bad. What started out as a mission to capture the Somalia war-lord, Mohamed Farrah Aidid, ended up being a rescue mission for troops and the downed pilot of a Black Hawk helicopter. Perhaps, you remember the event or seen the movie.

Emily Compagno, in her book Under His Wings: How Faith on the Front Lines has Protected American Troops, writes:

On October3, Jeff's squad was tasked with rescuing Private First Class Todd Blackburn, who fell while attempting to fast-rope from a Black Hawk helicopter. Two Black Hawks were shot down by members of the Somali National Alliance. During the fifteen hour raging battle, eighteen soldiers were killed, including two Delta Force operatives. Devastated Americans, and others around the world, were further horrified when footage emerged of a dead U.S. Soldier's body being dragged through the streets by terrorists. What had been a peacekeeping mission turned into the Battle of Mogadishu.

One of the men that lived through that event was Sergeant Jeff Struecker, squad leader assigned to Task Force Ranger of the U.S. Army's 75th Ranger Regiment. Jeff has gone on record as saying that he was 100 percent certain that he was going to die. Jeff said, "Way too many bad guys, way too many bullets."

Sergeant Struecker eventually led his group, though badly shot up, back to the base. Sgt. Struecker said that when he got back to the base, his buddies grabbed him and hugged him. Sgt. Struecker couldn't believe anybody made it out alive.

In the immediate aftermath, Sgt. Strucker faced questions from other guys as to how he was able to remain so calm during the battle. Sergeant Jeff Strucker's answer was profound and simple, "I was terrified at first, then I remembered what Jesus said to His Father: "Yet not my will, but Yours be done." You see, when Jeff Strucker was a teenager, someone shared the Gospel with him and he trusted Jesus as his Lord and Savior. Jeff began a committed relationship with Jesus then and was discipled along the way. So, the morning before Jeff Strucker went into battle, his regular morning devotion was about when Jesus prayed at the Garden of Gethsemane, "Yet not my will, but Yours be done." God knew not only what Jeff Strucker was going to need for his own peace, but so that others would not die in battle.

Sergeant Struecker ended up sharing his faith with his fellow Rangers. Struecker told them when you have your eternity secure, you can focus on what you need to focus on. And the time to settle that question is not while you are under fire. Many of those who were in the Battle of Mogadishu ended up accepting Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

Jeff Struecker eventually surrendered into the ministry and became a Chaplain in the U.S. Army taking care of Rangers. He knows combat and he knows the Lord, which made him a perfect fit for the Chaplaincy of the Ranger Regiment. He is now retired from the Army.
