

## **1. Unbelievable: Read Luke 24:25–27**

Question: What stands out to you about how difficult it was for the first disciples to believe Jesus had risen from the dead—even though He said He would?

What does that tell us about doubt and faith?

## **2. The Main Message: Read Acts 2:22–36**

Question: Why do you think the resurrection was the central point of the very first sermon?

Why do you think it remained the main emphasis of the apostles' teaching?

## **3. The Big Idea: Read 1 Corinthians 15:3–4**

Question: According to Paul, what is the core message of Christianity?

Why does the resurrection make it impossible to believe Jesus was only a good teacher?

## **4. Making It Personal and Public: Read Matthew 28:18–20 and Acts 2:38**

Question: In everyday life, how do people show they are fully committed to something (a team, cause, or relationship)?

Why do you think Jesus and Peter connect belief with baptism?

What is baptism saying about Jesus and what He has done for us?

## **5. Resurrection Power: Read Colossians 2:12–14**

Question: According to this passage, what does the power of the resurrection accomplish in our lives right now?

Where do you personally need that kind of new life or freedom?

## **6. Baptism Stories**

If you've been baptized, briefly share your story—what led you to take that step? Was there a specific “nudge” moment?
